

## Carnival of the Animals Grade 1, Week 6

Objective: to find and describe the two-note sound of the Cuckoo bird in "Cuckoo in the Depth of the Woods."

DIRECTIONS: Follow the google doc, clicking on every listening link. When you are done, click on the google form link at the bottom of the doc to answer some questions.

Hi friends! Today we are going to do our last lesson for Carnival of the Animals. We didn't get to every character, so I have included the link for the entire musical suite at the bottom of the doc!

I've saved one of my favorite pieces for last: "The Cuckoo in the Depth of the Woods." A Cuckoo is a kind of bird. He is named "cuckoo" because of his two note song. It has one high sound and one low sound. Listen to the cuckoo's song by clicking on the cuckoo and link below.




Did you hear it? You can almost hear the word, "Cuckoo!" Great! Now you are ready to hear the cuckoo music by Camille Saint-Saens. As you're listening, try to count how many times you hear the cuckoo's call. Draw tally marks for every time you hear the two-note call. Click on the cuckoo and link below to hear the music.



Did you hear the cuckoo's call? This time, listen again while watching a listening map.

What happens when the birds are highlighted? Click on the cartoon bird and link below to find the listening map.
