

## Activities for BYU Library FHC FamilySearch Intermediate Class 1: Duplicates in Family Tree, Part 1: Why They're There and How to Find Them

Here are some activities to help build skills at recognizing duplicates. Answers appear on the last page, but try to do the activities first without looking at the answers :)

### Duplicate or Not? Example 1

1. In beta Family Tree, go to the record for Sarah Ann Gunter:  
<https://beta.familysearch.org/tree/person/details/9JGH-NSN>  
Sarah Ann has a possible duplicate listed ([KJVN-8B2](#)). (Tip: If Family Tree doesn't display a hint for the duplicate, scroll down to the Tools section on the right and choose **Merge by ID**. Input the second ID and go to step 3 below.)
2. Review the information on each person's profile, including their change logs. Do you believe they are duplicates? Why or why not?
3. **IMPORTANT:** Even if you feel the records are duplicates, please don't merge them. Otherwise, other students will not be able to complete this exercise. Just close the browser tab or click **Back** at the top of the page to return to Sarah Ann's person page without merging.

### Duplicate or Not? Example 2

1. In beta Family Tree, go to the record for Charlotte Young:  
<https://beta.familysearch.org/tree/person/details/KWJ4-D8Q>  
Charlotte had a possible duplicate listed (LT7P-SZC). (Tip: If Family Tree doesn't display a hint for the possible duplicate, [click here to see it](#).)
2. Look at the information for the two records. Do you believe they are duplicates? Why or why not?
3. **IMPORTANT:** Even if you feel the records are duplicates, please don't merge them. Otherwise, other students will not be able to complete this exercise. Just close the browser tab or click **Back** at the top of the page to return to Charlotte's person page without merging.

## **Answers**

Example 1: The names, parents, and christening information for both Sarah Ann Gunters all match. These two records are definitely duplicates.

Example 2: Charlotte Young KWJ4-D8Q and Charlotte Young LT7P-SZC do not appear to be duplicates because they were born in different places and had different parents.
