FAQs

What do I need to apply?

You just need basic information, written responses, a resume, and the signed E-Board Contract Letter.

What is part of the E-Board Contract Letter?

This is what details information on: attendance, communication, Executive Board and Committee Meetings, and so forth. Please read it thoroughly before signing as your signature means compliance with the Contract's terms and conditions.

When will I be notified of a decision?

All decision letters will be sent on July 10th, after the interviews are completed.

Interview Process Outline

To select an interview slot, the Executive Chair will send a Google Appointment link to your FSU email upon reviewing and accepting your application. Down below is the general format of the interview, please be aware this does not include additional questions and comments within the zoom interview. Rather, it is an idea of a few primary questions.



1. Introduction & Icebreaker
 - a. Small introduction of yourself! (e.g., name, age, fun fact about yourself)
2. Tell me something not in your application!
 - a. Fun facts, favorite books, favorite authors, favorite memory, favorite restaurant
3. Please rank the order of the positions that you want most (may be discarded if answered in the application).
4. What leadership roles and experiences have prepared you for the role(s) you want?
5. What is your leadership style when it comes to working with others or by yourself?
6. What other commitments do you have and how do you plan to prioritize Lex et Lux Society with them?
7. Role-Specific Questions – a set of questions based on the ranking of desired position(s)
8. Scenario-Based Questions – a set of hypotheticals to gauge critical thinking, situational awareness, and responses.
