Proverbs 12 is marked by its sharp contrasts between righteousness and wickedness, emphasizing the enduring value of wisdom, integrity, and disciplined living. It opens with a bold declaration that loving discipline is a mark of wisdom, while rejecting correction is foolishness. Throughout the chapter, Solomon contrasts the stability of the righteous with the transience of the wicked, whose plans and words are deceitful and destructive. It sketches a portrait of the kind of person who thrives under God's favor and builds a life that cannot be shaken.

D.	How have you experienced being "filled with good" (verse 14) from the fruit of your words or actions?

E. What does it mean to "ignore an insult"? (verse 16) How can this be practiced in emotionally charged situations?	
F. What do verses 24 & 27 teach about diligence and laziness? How do they challenge or affirm your current work habits?	
G. What does "In the path of righteousness there is life" (verse 28) mean to you in practical terms?
