Rationale

For the final E Tool I chose Quizlet this allows me to question the students in a number of different ways. It also uses flashcards for the students to use as revision. I found that it was better than studystack.com as that is aimed at students who are studying for their GCSE's, you can create your own but I feel Quizlet is more suitable. Another ETool I found that is similar to Quizlet is headmagnet.com, this mainly uses flash cards, it states that it can predict what memories have faded, how can it do this without knowing the students.

I found quizlet to be very versatile, it can question students in many different ways, it has flash cards, quizzes in many different forms for example, it can be multiple choice, true or false or just a question that the students have to answer. It can also be simplified for students who are less able than others, it will keep students engaged, wanting to learn as well as answer the questions. The students as well as the teacher can set the difficulty of the questions.

Quizlet can help students with spelling, you can learn by giving the definitions and the students need to give the answer. Evaluation

Quizlet allowed me to assess the students learning in many different ways, allowing differentiation.
