Major Scholarship Highlight:

Greenhouse Scholars Scholarship

Amount: Up to \$5,000 per year for four years

Deadline: November 13, 2024 (Part 1)

Eligibility: Scholarship is open to graduating high school seniors planning to attend a four-year accredited academic institution. Applicants must demonstrate financial need (annual household income no greater than \$80,000) and have a cumulative, unweighted GPA of 3.5 or above.
