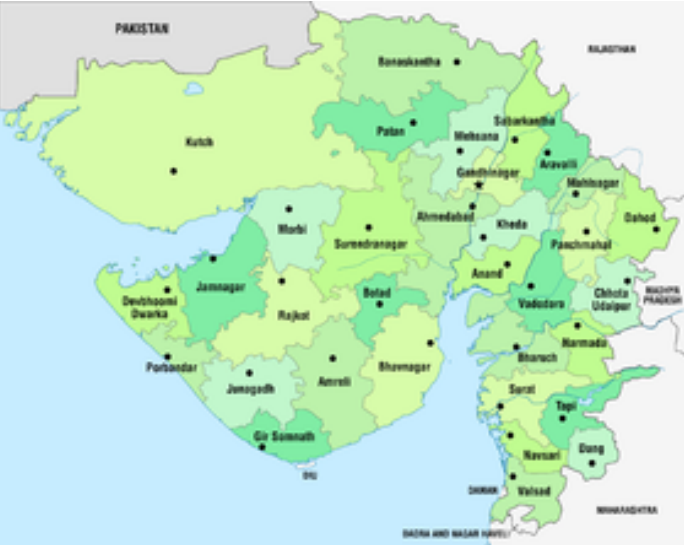


Let's celebrate Gujarati!

Gujarati is the sixth most widely spoken language in India. It has more than 50 million native speakers!



Gujarati evolved hundreds of years ago from Sanskrit. It is mainly spoken in the Indian state of Gujarat.

The Gujarati script is adapted from the Devanāgarī script.
