Draw a map or describe in words (using roads as boundaries) your COI. You can submit your own draft map through the ESRI interface if you are comfortable with it.

Submit it to the redistricting commission or other appropriate body. Do it in writing, and follow up with oral testimony if you can. Demographers and the commissions are required to address submitted requests or explain why they were unable to fulfill the request to keep a COI together.

Examine draft maps and critique, suggest changes if goals are not met.

Examples:

- Victims of lead poisoning from the car battery smelters fall right on the boundary between LABOS SD1 and SD4. They feel that they have no champion.
- SFV (Population 1.8 M) is bisected into SD3 and SD5. Latinos in SFV feel drowned out by wealthy white NIMBYs in Malibu, Agoura Hills, and Calabasas. A SFV district could potentially provide a majority Latino district.
- Huge Chinese American community, neatly bisected into SD1 and SD5, wants to stay together.
- SGV (2+ M) is largely Latino and AAPI, bound together by air pollution, traffic, and economy; want to stay in one district instead of three.
- Armenian American community in Glendale & Burbank want to stay together
