

MUN Resolution for SC

Main submitter - Armenia

Co-submitter - France, Canada, United States, Lebanon

Signatories - Azerbaijan, Turkiye, Israel, UK, Lebanon

Preambulatory Clauses

Acknowledges the troops placed in the Nagorno-Karabakh region while in the Azerbaijan territorial regime.

Recognizes the violation that both parties have made over the years.

Reiterates the absence of Russian peacekeepers at the corridor

Deeply concerned over the ethnic cleansing and safety of the Armenian people in the region of Nagorno Karabakh.

Alarmed of the unlawful closing of the Lachin corridor by Azerbaijan

Reminds Armenian citizens that given the extent of their mistreatment, the people of Karabakh do not feel safe in the Nagorno-Karabakh region under Azerbaijan control.

Draw to Attention that the Soviet Union has not taken into account the ethnic importance of the region to Armenia

Operative Clauses

1. Limiting military power for both Armenia and Azerbaijan
 - a. 100,000 maximum soldiers for both parties near the borders of the region.
 - b. 1,000 tanks for both parties near the borders of the region.
 - c. 250 artillery ordnance for both parties near the borders of the region.
 - d. Non-armed military planes are allowed near the borders of the region and no armed planes are allowed unless permission is granted by the UN
 - e. The military should be only placed on both borders of the country
2. Open the Lachin Corridor.
 - a. Monitored by UN peacekeeping forces.
 - b. Limited control of the Armenian military

- I. If the corridor of Human rights shall be violated if Armenia goes over the military limit
 - c. 250 UN peacekeepers at the border
 - I. 125 on the Azerbaijani side of the border
 - II. 125 on the Armenian side of the border
 - lii. 100 peacekeepers dedicated from Afghanistan
 - iV. Allowing the UN to oversee Nagorno-Karabakh and be part of decisions and oversight of police
 - d. In case of military action of one of these countries, the UN is allowed to provide humanitarian support but no military support unless absolutely necessary.
 - e. Within the Nagorno-Karabakh region, UN policemen will monitor the region with non-lethal weapons
3. Humanitarian aid will help restore the damages made in the region
- a. Infrastructure shall be regenerated by the Armenian government
 - b. Civilian infrastructure reconstruction will be provided by the UN
 - c. Military infrastructure reconstruction will be provided by only the country itself unless other countries are willing to provide personal assistance.
 - d. People of the Karabakh region shall have free will to continue living in the region
