Speaker: Ryan Bishop, AD BHS:

- Sports overview
 - o 22 sports
 - BHS does not cut students from sports, except boys basketball and soccer.
 - o BHS tries to balance inclusion while keeping the sports competitive.
 - The level of commitment is high. Kids often have to participate every day. Practices are mandatory.
 - o Not all seniors make a varsity level.
- How to get information?
 - All coaches are listed on the BHS Athletic website https://boh.bvsd.org/athletics. The webpage lists the coaches by season. Parents can contact the coaches or Ryan Bishop.
 - o 8th graders will get information on how to participate in the summer soon.
 - o There is a Meet the Coaches night; students can sign up to be on the Constant Contact list.
- Summer training
 - o BHS is encouraging 8th graders to lift weights over the summer.
 - o There are some youth camps: wrestling, basketball, football.
 - Football and golf start July 30. Every other sport starts August 7.
 - Registration for athletics opens four weeks before the season starts.
 - All students need a physical; better to do that over the summer than in August.
- There are fees associated with the sports.
- If kids don't make a team, the coaches and athletic department help the student find other sports or club teams to participate.
- Clubs: Tier 1: Clubs that meet at lunch (no funding); Tier 2: Some organized events (little funding); Tier 3: Ultimate frisbee and mountain bike (a little funding)
- Parents should support students' journey; not hesitate to reach out; and encourage students to get involved and stick with it (but don't force it)
