Life Maps

Description

This week is focused on building a sense of community within the classroom by allowing students to introduce themselves and their life stories through Life Map presentations. The Navigate app will also be introduced.

Learning Outcomes

Learners will be able to:

- Understand more about themselves through reflection on what has led them to Texas A&M
- Understand more about their classmates to build a sense of commonalities or shared experiences with their classmates
- Explore the Navigate Student Success App

Connection to Intended Course Outcomes/Class Objectives

- Self-awareness Your understanding of your personal strengths, learning styles, learning habits, and thinking patterns
- Actively engaged active involvement of time and energy invested in your college experience—both inside and outside the classroom.
- Socially integrated formation of personal connections between other members of the Texas A&M community including peers, faculty, staff, and administrators

Preparation, Materials & Facilitators

- The instructor should provide the instructions for this activity the week before.
- Tip: Have students submit the assignment prior to class digitally, then create a PowerPoint with all of their Life Maps. This ensures everyone can easily see each Life Map.
- Print out one copy of the Life Maps Active Listening worksheet for each student.

- Life Maps 39 minutes
- Navigate 8 minutes
- Wrap Up 3 minutes

Facilitator Instructions

- Text in regular front are talking points and should be read out loud to students.
- · Text in *italics* are notes for the instructor and should NOT be read out loud to students.
- Text in **bold** are questions for debrief or reflection and should be read out loud to students to encourage group discussion or sharing of ideas.



Life Maps		
Talking Points 3 minutes	 Howdy! Welcome back to Hullabaloo U week 2. Peer mentor can lead a quick check in activity (roses, buds, thorns; thumbs up/down; two word check in) Today you all will have a chance to share more about yourselves and tell us more about your story. As each person shares, you will demonstrate your active listening skills while completing the Life Maps Worksheet to jot down something you have in common with that individual and something interesting or something you want to learn more about. We will collect these worksheets at the end of class – your successful completion of the sheet will be your attendance and participation grade this week. So, let's jump right in! 	
Activity 30 minutes	 Presenting the Life Map is a key component of this activity. Students should have 1 minute to present their Life Maps to the group with time left over for any questions or clarification from the class. Please note that both instructors and peer mentors should demonstrate first so that students understand how to give the presentations and the length of time. Instructors should pull up a timer so that students can monitor their 1 minute timeframe. 	
Debrief 5 minutes	 Why would we do an activity like this? What did you learn about yourself during this activity? What common experiences did you see? Why is it important to address common experiences? What else do you want to know about each other? 	
Transition 1 minute	 Thank you all so much for sharing more about yourselves today! Seeing commonalities and similar experiences helps us build a stronger community and it was so fun to hear about your stories and what has led you to Texas A&M. We are going to shift gears a bit and talk about the Navigate App which will help you during your time here at Texas A&M.
