I also had the opportunity to fundraise, learn artifact handling and preservation techniques, build mounts for displays, understand case management and mechanics, and participate in the installation and deinstallation of exhibits. While the exhibits I worked on were displayed, I was a part of the education team planning programs and teaching classes that visited the museum. Additionally, I worked closely with museum staff and faculty guest curators as part of a curatorial team.

Project Consultant, The Art of Ranching Project, CSU Extension, July 2023 – Present

The Art of Ranching project is aimed at youth ages 8-18. It is a collaborative community history project that works with 4-H youth and a Historical Topic related to Colorado agriculture to make visible the agricultural labor and legacy of Colorado communities. As the project consultant I am part of the administrative team behind the project, and work with 4-H youth and CSU interns to facilitate their participation in the project.

Worked with the College of Agricultural Sciences at CSU to create an “Identity Wall” exhibit that displays pieces of history the college has directly contributed to. This project required work in libraries and archives, digital management and planning, design, label writing, and communications.

Research Assistant, Public Lands History Center, Fort Collins, CO, January 2022 – September 2022

This project produced a one-hundred-page cultural resources management chapter for the Public Lands History Center’s partner organization, Colorado Parks and Wildlife. This chapter discussed the history and management of cultural resources at Ridgway State Park near Ouray, Colorado, and provided actionable management recommendations for the park’s resources. The chapter catered to the management needs of the park and is used to facilitate interpretation efforts at the park. GIS maps and cultural resource forms, which were completed during field surveys, were created as part of the project to facilitate a complete chapter.
