We are reaching out to you because of your role in the ebook/EPUB publishing community. As you know, technology is constantly evolving. One such technology, currently central to EPUB files, is XML, more exactly the XML syntax of HTML (XHTML). Use of this syntax is declining outside of publishing. In order to provide for the future of the EPUB ecosystem, we plan not to require the XML syntax any more in the EPUB package.

This change will not affect the document formats currently allowed in an EPUB publication, it would simply remove the restriction to the XML syntax.

We hope to understand how this might affect the community. That way, we can identify potential obstacles and make an easier transition to accepting HTML.

Your input is valuable, and will help shape the future of ebooks.
