

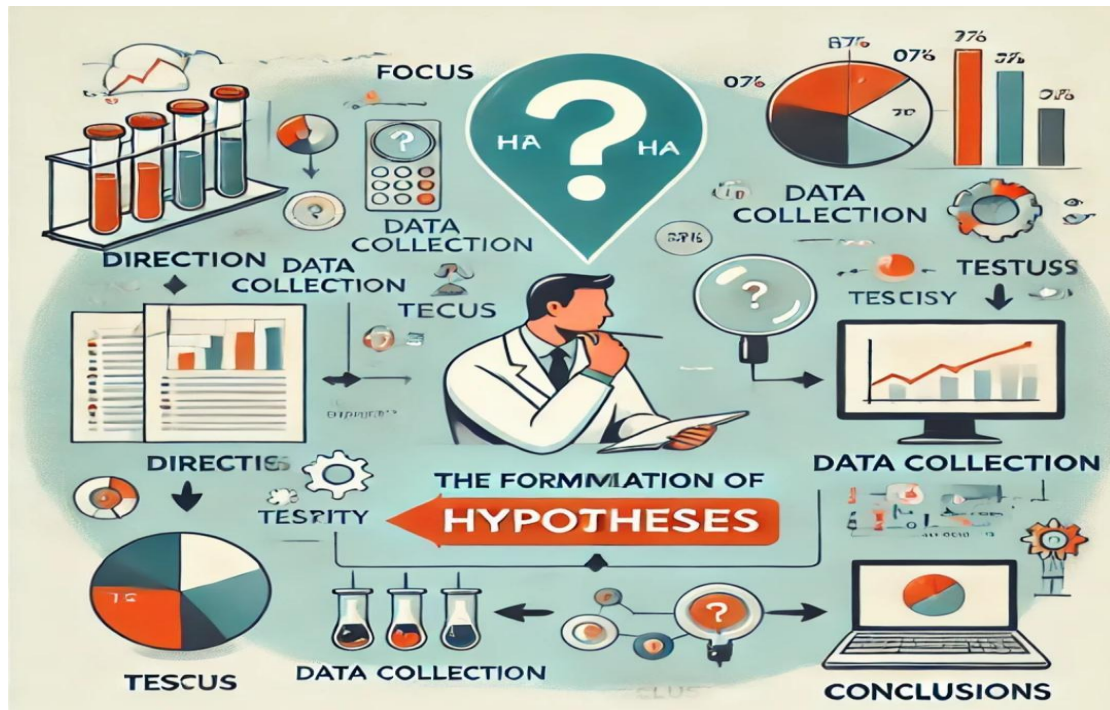
Formulation of Hypotheses: Needs

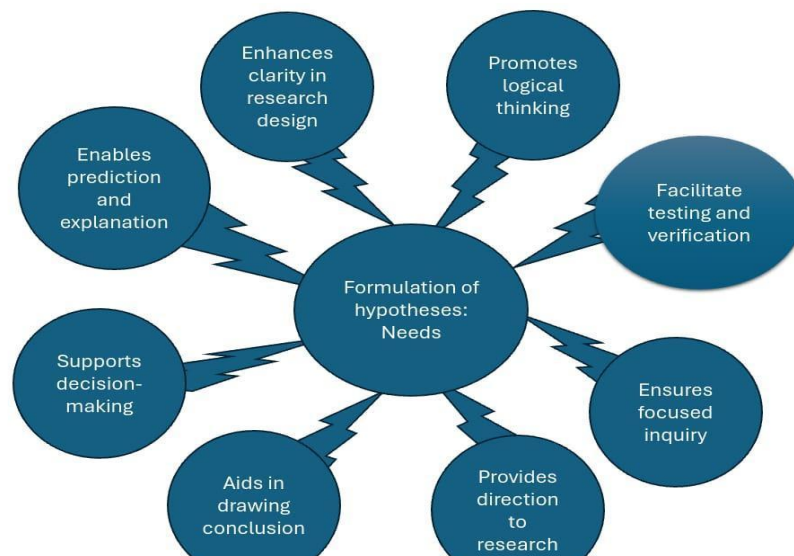
