

KENO VIRTUAL GUIDELINE

Please read the [Virtual Rules and Regulations](#) to understand how to play the virtual game.

An ASL VIDEO version of the rules will be explained in REAL TIME for each event. The video will be pinned during the LIVE FB posting at each event.

OBJECTIVE: The objective of the game is to have the most matching numbers from the scorecard out of all participants to win!

The number of games to be played or the amount of number to match will be determined by the tournament operations coordinators.

Keno scorecard will be given to you by the tournament operations coordinators. Your goal is to play 10 rounds and match one or more of the keno numbers on your scorecard.

If this rule were added to the game, in odd-numbered games(1,3,5,7,9), you can match any number from the scorecard. In even-numbered games(2,4,6,8,10), you must announce the number from the scorecard before your first throw. You can either type the score or announce it before your first throw. Both are acceptable.

POINTS SYSTEM - how to score 10 rounds format- please see the following 10 rounds guideline for the scoring system. [10 ROUNDS VIRTUAL GUIDELINE](#)

- **Points:**
- Bag on the board will be one point.
- Bag in the hole will be three points.



- **During gameplay** - you may end the game at any point of the game if you match the number.
- For example- you are on your first bag in the 8th round, you currently have 58 points. If you have 58 on your keno scorecard and you would like to end the game, you may do that.

TIEBREAKER - Ties may happen and there will be no tiebreaker system for this event.

- If the top two (or more) winners are tied, they both are the winners.
