There will be supervision for those who stay during lunch. Any student who wishes to go home for lunch will be allowed to do so. Supervision is provided for all organized, approved extracurricular activities.

III. School Closings

Once the school district calendar has been officially adopted by the Board of Education, it is the policy of the district to have the schools in operation full time every day provided for in the calendar. Occasionally, there will be a need to shorten the school day, not to open school, or to make some other emergency alteration in the schedule. In these instances, the SwiftK12 Alert Solutions will be activated. Some reasons for school closings include: severe storms; facility failures; energy problems; direction from the State Department of Education; other unforeseen emergency reasons.

A. Closing Within A School Day

In case an unanticipated storm strikes during the school day, we will make every effort to keep the schools open until the regular closing hours. If conditions require us to dismiss students earlier, every reasonable effort will be made by our staff to advise responsible adult members of the household, transportation services and police. In these instances, the SwiftK12 Alert Solutions will be activated. Occasionally, a planned professional activity for the staff will require an early dismissal of students. Well in advance of the early closing day, the school administration will notify students, parents, bus services and the police department so that necessary arrangements for the early dismissal can be made.

B. "Emergency School Closing Days / Delayed Openings / Early Dismissals"

When an emergency storm or other conditions make it impossible or unwise to operate a regularly scheduled school day, this decision will be made by the Superintendent of Schools and communicated to all interested parties. In these instances, the SwiftK12 Alert Solutions will be activated and announcements will also be made on Cranford's local access channel TV35 and will be posted on www.cranfordschools.org.

CRISIS RESPONSE PLAN

The Cranford School District has a Crisis Response Plan that is designed to minimize danger to anyone occupying a school should an emergency occur. Our main objective is to attend to the health and welfare of your children in the event of a crisis.

In most emergencies, your children will remain and be cared for at the school they attend. In the rare event of an emergency that prohibits reentry to a school building (such as a broken gas or water main, a fire, or a toxic spill), students will be transported via school transportation/or walk to the nearest and most appropriate school building. High School students will be dismissed to return home for the day.

The following procedure will be implemented for school emergencies:

- 1. The SwiftK12 Alert Solutions will be activated. As necessary, announcements will also be made on Cranford's local access channel TV35 and will be posted on www.cranfordschools.org.
- 2. PLEASE DO NOT TELEPHONE THE SCHOOL. We have limited phone lines that MUST be used to respond to emergencies.
- 3. PLEASE DO NOT COME TO THE SCHOOL UNLESS YOU ARE REQUESTED TO PICK UP YOUR CHILD. Any emergency involving your child's school may mean emergency vehicles and workers must be able to get to the building. If the emergency necessitates relocation of staff and students, you will be informed.
- 4. As soon as possible, emergency information will be shared with you as described above.

It is most essential in such abnormal situations that telephone lines not be blocked by a flood of inquiring calls. Telephone lines and attending personnel should be allowed to handle the essential tasks of dealing with the emergency situation. The safety and welfare of many people depend on your understanding and cooperation in this matter. Again, except when we find it impossible or unwise to open school on a scheduled school day, **schools will be open**. It will be the responsibility of parents to determine whether the health conditions of their children or weather conditions are such as to justify keeping them home.

REMINDER: Unless otherwise announced, the regular monthly meeting of the Cranford Board of Education is held at 7:30 p.m. on the fourth Monday of each month at Lincoln School. The Board of Education holds an open work session two weeks prior to the regular meeting on the second Monday of the month in the Board Room at Lincoln School.
