## WHO IS THIS GUIDE FOR?

This guide is meant for Product Managers and Data Analysts to assist in conducting Competitive or Comparative (CC) analysis on a Product one is working on. It will help in explaining analysis techniques used in Hack for LA and in different industries in CC analysis.

## WHAT IS COMPETITIVE ANALYSIS?

Competitive analysis is the process of identifying competitors and evaluating their products, services and strategies in order to determine their strengths and weaknesses in order to better your own Product or Services. The goal of the competitive analysis is to gather the intelligence necessary to find a line of attack and develop your go-to-market strategy

## Benefits of Competitive Analysis

- Identify Product's true Value proposition and what makes your product different from competitors', which can inform future marketing efforts.
- Understand competitor's modus-operandi and get benchmarks to help you measure your own success and growth.
- Improve your brand by capitalizing on their weaknesses and building on their strengths.
- Opportunity to read Customer's reviews and understand market demand and features customer requested.
- Discover new market areas that aren't covered by any competitors and gauge market conditions. .

## How to do Competitive Analysis

- Determine who your competitors are by determining (Who) Customers, (What) Problem and (How) Product Solution. Based on these factors our competitors are classified in two categories.
  - Direct Competitors: Product or Service similar to ours and operating in same customer base
  - Indirect Competitors: Products or Service similar but in different customer base or vice versa
- Determine what products your competitors offer.  
Analyze your competitor's complete product line and the quality of the products or services they're offering (Volume, Market Share, Characteristics, Pricing strategies, Supply Chain)
- Research your competitors sales tactics and results.

# Guide: Competitive or Comparative Analysis

Analyze your competitor's Sales process, Channels, Locations, Partner Selling Programs, Revenue, etc

- Take a look at your competitors' pricing, as well as any perks they offer.  
Understand the difference between features of your Product and Competitor's Product for the correct Pricing model.
- Analyze how your competitors market their products.  
Analyze your competitor's marketing techniques like blogs, ebooks, videos, slide decks, FAQs, articles, press releases, media kit, case studies or advertising campaigns. Take note of your competition's content strategy. Analyze the level of engagement on your competitor's content and reviews.
- Learn what technology stack your competitors' use.  
Understanding what types of technology your competitors' use can be critical for helping your own company reduce friction and increase momentum within your organization.
- Look at their social media presence, strategies, and go-to platforms.  
Analyze your competitor's social media platforms like Facebook, Twitter, Pinterest, LinkedIn, etc to understand the business strategy, frequency of posts and content engagement.
- Perform a SWOT Analysis to learn their strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats.  
Note of your competitor's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats any time you assess an overall grade.
