After the training we will have students come to our MIT Water Night, a free event open to everyone, to present their posters to the attendees. We hope to have a large showing from the local community and invite all families to attend to learn about the most pressing issues faced with water today while enjoying food, art, speakers, activities for younger children, and posters for related research.
