Opening

Fundraiser update:

- \$500 made through poinsettia sales
- Winter pizza – 888 slices per week for winter session
 - o Gary (parent volunteer) and Andrea able to continue running
 - o Approximately \$700 a week made from pizza, forecast \$7,000
 - o Will continue Spring pizza (May June) so orders sometime in April
- Seasonal fundraising discussion
 - o Targeted end of March fundraiser – Chocolate – Reids & Rheo Thompson inquiries to be made about program logistics and special request accommodations

Schoolyard enhancements:

- WRDSB procurement group is standing by to support efforts once we have the money to spend
 - o \$50,000 is absolutely a reasonable target for the enhancements under consideration
- We will get a subcommittee formed to get grant-writing underway etc
- We will establish a survey for the community to understand preference of outdoor enhancement focus
 - o Rolled out to the staff community for input separately
 - Derive options for broader community survey from this result
- Tamara to follow up in understanding what it would take to enhance the “backyard” with turf, and potentially structures similar to those in front of the YWCA operated daycare

- Gaga ball pit grant request: No update
- There was at one point \$2,000 ear-marked for a scooter rack
 - o While there are some scooters which make their way to school, this may not be the best allocation of funds
 - o Potentially re-allocate fund in the event the gaga-ball pit grant is un-successful
- It was determined that greater transparency into the fundraising efforts would help drive success, ensuring the community can see how their commitment will be utilized

Tamara update:

Pink shirt day and random act of kindness, “Safe caring and inclusive schools”

- Counsel and community should be aware of considerations to safe caring and inclusive schools
 - o Character and leadership development, safe and healthy schools, equity and inclusive educations, student engagement and parent / community engagement
 - o What’s coming in Safe caring and inclusive school initiative
 - February being recognized as Black History Month
 - Friday prior to family day weekend – Random Act of Kindness Day
 - End of February – Pink Shirt Day
- We have teams dedicated to Assembly’s, Safe Caring and Inclusive Schools etc
 - o There is cross-functional effort underway to understand how they can work together and drive home the SCIS messaging
 - o Safe Caring and Inclusive Schools team does require a parent participant
 - Opportunity for a parent from the community to participate

Voice of community update:

- Feedback has come from the broader community that we do not feel engaged with the school
 - o Lack of opportunity such as winter concert to connect with student peers and parents
 - o The “post-pandemic” community (those with students who joined since 2020) has had a very different experience, and feels arms length from what goes on
 - Planned events year have included/will include:
 - Welcome to kindergarten (prior to school beginning)
 - Meet the teacher night (early school year)
 - Track and field (end of school year, including parallel primary event)
- The re-implementation of assembly is a broader discussion amongst the team
 - o VP Tamara discussed a thoughtful approach to re-implementing assembly, noting that it doesn’t make sense to gather K-6 and expect order for the duration of a 45 minute session
 - Additionally, Remembrance day was not deemed the appropriate “return to assembly” subject matter (the Council agreed)

- Michael Kopysh (on behalf of outside community input) noted that while this is understandable, eliminating their existence altogether creates siloes where there should be school-wide communication and alignment, and contributes to the overall lack of community feeling amongst the school and parents
