Safety Drills During the School Year (All Grades)

Keeping students and staff safe is a priority for FCPS. Each school has an emergency preparedness plan to respond to incidents such as fires and tornadoes. Schools are required by state law to practice emergency drills, including lockdown drills, each year. Schools are also required to notify parents and guardians at least 24 hours before a

school conducts a lockdown drill. However, schools are not required to give the specific date and time of the drill in advance.

The first lockdown drill of the school year must take place within the first 20 days of school. Preschool and kindergarten students are exempt from practicing the first lockdown drill.

Your child may come home and talk about their experience during the drill. We encourage you to talk with your child about the importance of being prepared for emergencies. Please review these frequently asked questions to support your students before and after school lockdown drills.

▲ Know Our Security Terms

FCPS uses specific terminology to describe the actions school staff and students should take to ensure safety in a variety of situations. It is important for staff, families, and students to understand what the different terms mean and how they impact school operations.

Watch this video to learn about safety terms including lockdown; secure the building: and stay put, stay tuned.

If students, staff, or families have a safety concern at school (that is not an immediate emergency), they should submit a tip to the FCPS Safety Tipline. In an emergency, please call 9-1-1.

Ensuring Student Safety: Register for Volunteer FCPS (All Grades)

At Aldrin Elementary, our volunteers are a vital part of our school community. We deeply value the time and care they give to our students.

Recent updates to our volunteer process focus on one primary goal: keeping students safe.

These updates — such as checks against the sex offender registry and, in some cases, criminal background checks — are safety measures that will help us maintain a secure and supportive learning environment for every student in our care.

We encourage all our parents and community members interested in supporting our students by volunteering at school to visit Volunteer FCPS-Aldrin click "Learn More," and then "Sign Up." After you create a profile, you will view an orientation video and complete a volunteer application.

<u>Volunteer FCPS</u> ensures a safe, consistent, and welcoming environment at all of our schools. **All volunteers must be registered in Volunteer FCPS**. This includes individuals who volunteer to chaperone on field trips, work at book fairs, and help out regularly in classrooms, libraries, or cafeterias. Volunteers who work unsupervised with students will also be required to undergo a background check.

We understand these changes may seem disruptive, especially for long-time volunteers. Our intent is to ensure that our students feel safe and supported with each and every person they encounter at school.

As a reminder, all volunteers — and visitors to a school — are required to sign in by scanning their ID at our visitor kiosk. Visit the <u>Volunteer FCPS Frequently Asked</u>

Every Day Counts: Setting Your Child Up for Success (All Grades)

September is Attendance Awareness Month. There are many ways parents and caregivers can help their children create healthy routines and make a habit of getting to school on time every day. Some examples include:

- Set a regular bedtime and morning routine. (Need help? Download this checklist in <u>English</u> or <u>Spanish</u>.)
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents for advice on how to make them feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- When possible, avoid medical appointments or extended trips when school is in session.

Everything You Need to Do Through SIS ParentVUE (All Grades)

Don't forget your back-to-school forms and checklists! Make sure you have a <u>SIS</u> <u>ParentVUE</u> account for your family and log in to find important forms and updates.

If you do not have a ParentVUE account, contact your child's school for an activation code and follow the directions on the <u>SIS ParentVUE Account webpage</u>.

☑ Update Contact Information

Be among the first to know about weather closings, bus delays, and other critical communications from your school and FCPS by providing your cell phone number and email in <u>SIS ParentVUE</u>. To update your contact information in SIS ParentVUE, click the "Online Packets" tab in the upper right of the screen, then click the "Online Verification/Update" icon.

Parents/caregivers who do not have a <u>ParentVUE account</u> should contact their school for an activation code to create an account, or print and complete the <u>Emergency Care</u> <u>Information Form</u> and submit it to our front office.

Submit Absences

Parents/caregivers can submit daylong absences through SIS ParentVUE. Log in to the platform and click "Report Absence."

Partial day absences and changes of transportation should still be reported directly to your school's front office.

Review and Submit Immunization Forms

Parents/caregivers can check their child's immunization compliance and submit immunization records in SIS ParentVUE. Records may also be delivered to our front office.

If needed, families may also provide <u>other immunization documentation</u> including a health care provider's written statement of a permanent or temporary medical exemption or a notarized <u>Religious Exemption Form</u>.

Remember to Complete Permission Forms for School Resources (All Grades)

Families can easily grant permission for their children to access a variety of school resources through the Parent Digital Consent system. Opt your child in or out of a variety of online educational tools and choose how student information is managed. Parents/caregivers of elementary students should opt in/out of after-school care on early release Wednesdays.

SEL Screener Parent Notification and Updates (Grades 3 - 6)

The Fall Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) Screener will be administered to students in grades 3 through 12 in October.

Students use the SEL Screener twice a year to share their perspectives on how well their school and community help them develop skills they need to succeed. The screener works by asking questions or presenting statements that students can think about and respond to. This gives students a way to share how well their school community makes them feel valued, included, and supported.

After each screening, results are available in the Documents tab of SIS ParentVUE and mailed to families without a ParentVUE account. For more information including SEL Screener questions and opt-out information, please visit FCPS' <u>Social-Emotional</u> <u>Learning (SEL) Screener</u> webpage.

Make Sure Your Children Are Up-to-Date on Immunizations (All Grades)

Please make sure your child has all of their necessary immunizations. Remember, all students are <u>required to be immunized</u> against certain diseases to attend school in Virginia. This is an important part of keeping children healthy!

Starting Tuesday, November 18, students who have not provided proof of immunization may not be allowed to attend school. Visit the How To Submit Immunization Documents webpage for step-by-step guidance on how to check your child's immunization status and submit updated immunization information

Please check with your health care provider to make sure your child is up to date on required immunizations for the 2025-26 school year. If your child needs an immunization, make an appointment with your healthcare provider, visit the Fairfax
County Health Department website for a list of child immunization clinics, or view other Immunization Resources. Be wise and immunize!

Weather Happens, FCPS is Ready (All Grades)

Virginia is no stranger to inclement weather. From severe thunderstorms to high winds to flooding, there are many different types of weather events that can (and sometimes do) impact our schools. But FCPS has a plan for each of these scenarios that prioritizes the safety of all our students and staff. What does FCPS do during a flood? What about a severe thunderstorm?

New Math Screening and Growth Assessment for Elementary Students (Grades 1 - 6)

Starting in September, FCPS elementary schools will use the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) Math assessment to assess grade level mathematics skills in grades 1-6. The MAP Math test along with the iReady Reading test fulfill a state requirement to measure academic growth in grades 3-6 throughout the school year.

MAP Math tests are administered in the fall, winter, and spring. They help teachers identify students' strengths and areas where they may need more support.

Transportation Patience and Safety (All Grades)

Thank you for your patience as we all get used to new routines this school year. We appreciate our families following Kiss and Ride procedures and being patient while waiting for your children's buses.

If your student's bus is delayed, you may access the <u>Bus Delay Notification System</u> or use the <u>Here Comes the Bus mobile app</u> to receive the delayed bus report. Email messages will be sent to announce significant bus delays. Please contact the Transportation Office at 703-249-7100 with any additional questions. For concerns after 5:30 p.m., contact the FCPS Office of Safety and Security at 571-423-2000.

Update your contact information in <u>SIS ParentVUE</u> to make sure you receive email messages about bus delays.

See Where Your Child Goes Online With Lightspeed (All Grades)

Parents can access their child's activity on FCPS devices through Lightspeed, the school division's internet content filtering service. Parents may sign up for a <u>weekly Parent Report</u>, which will provide a list of the top sites their child visited.

The report also offers parents the ability to sign up for the Internet Use Parent Portal. Through the portal, parents may pause their child's access to the internet on their FCPS device during non-school hours.

Help Keep Students Safe — Become a Crossing Guard (All Grades)

Dependable and caring adults are needed to serve as crossing guards, helping students safely bike and walk to and from our schools. This is a great opportunity for retirees, stay-at-home parents, or anyone looking to make a difference in their community. Crossing guards will earn \$16.50 per hour and receive bonus time: Work 30 minutes before and 30 minutes after school for a total of one hour a day and earn \$33.00.
