
Synopsis

They had a storefront on Oxford Lane and they had been in business for 2 years. The name was Quintessential Antiquities. There was an online application. She filled it out. Then she received some instructions from the owner that seemed a little odd. He said that he had accepted her application and she could begin working right away. She would be paid by way of commission. He needed representatives in the US to purchase fine art for him that he would then sell in England. The vendors that he wanted to buy art from in the U.S., would only accept money from a source from within the U.S. For that reason, he wanted to have representatives in the U.S. pay for art that he was interested in, by depositing checks from him that were drawn from his business account in England, and then western union the transaction amount to the "art dealer" in the US. Whatever was left over in the representative's account would be their commission. This didn't sound at all like the advertisement for part time employment that she had signed up for, and she started to question the validity of the businesses. He told her that she would be receiving the check in 2 business days, and he wanted her to email him right away with the confirmation code that the western union had taken place so that he knew when to expect his artwork to arrive. She received the check, and noticed that the letter had been sent from California. California?

She thought that this guy was based out of England. If he had a representative in California, why didn't they just complete the transaction instead of her? So she called the bank that it was written from. The account was a fake. She called the business directly in England, and they had never heard of Salam before. And then it hit her. He had picked a legitimate business in England to claim that he was from, and pretended to be buying pieces of art from legitimate businesses in the US so that he appeared to be sincere in his request. In all reality, there was no art to be bought. There was no business deal to be made. He didn't even have a real business account. He would be floating a counterfeit check that was made up in California by one of his associates that she would deposit into her own account that he would be the recipient of when the cash on the other end of the Western Union went through. As soon as the bank verified that the check was a fraud, she would have been left holding the bag. She was so angry that she could scream. So she emailed the scammer, trying to catch him in his own lies. "Why don't you just have the person from California deposit this check for you?" "Trust the company" was the reply. The cashier check fraud is used to fund terrorist activity and for drug money for high govt officials in Nigeria.



They have 3 days to come up with 20 million dollars, and 24 hours to air the story that 2 Americans are being held as hostages in Nigeria or they will reveal all.



Narabe and his father would never be one of those people. The newest strategy of kidnapping relatives of prominent people has become more popular. The father says that in Nigeria, child prostitutes were on the rise, and most were captured by illegal Nigerian immigrants. Almost all of the girls were between 10 and 15 years old. The one's that are kidnapped are usually from people that are currently in or have been involved in the government. Her ex-husband was an ex CIA agent, and they obviously felt that they had something to bargain with by kidnapping their 15 year old daughter. Being a poor country, they have to rely on terrorist

activity to voice their concerns to the world. They use any platform that they can in order to get their points across...even if the consequences mean the possibility of death.



After lunch, she decides to go outside to clear her head and without thinking, she calls her ex-husband. She tells him where she is. He can't believe that she just did that! They will hear you! He tells her not to talk about where she is while she is on the cell phone, but within seconds, while she is speaking with him, she is taken hostage and the terrorist gets on the phone with her ex-husband.
