Abstract in English and Indonesian was presented on the same page as the Title. The abstract **did not exceed 200 words** with a font size of 10pt and single spacing.

Background: Brief description of the research problem and findings of previous research, not definitions or explanations of the research topic.....

Objective: beginning with the phrase 'This research aimed to'.....

Methods: brief description of the design, population/sample/subject/object/target, data collection techniques, and data analysis techniques that were used.....

Results: brief description of the data analysis results that were obtained.....

Conclusion: description of goal achievement and benefits of the research that was conducted.....

Keywords: 3-5 keywords in English, 10 pt, italics, separated with " ; "

INTRODUCTION (11 PT, BOLD)

The paper was written in Palatino, size 11, and in A4 document format (210mm x 297mm) with margins of 2 cm at the top, 2 cm at the bottom, 3 cm on the left, and 2 cm on the right, fully justified. The document content, including tables, graphs, and images, consisted of 10-15 pages. The title was concise, informative, and did not exceed 12 words. The article was formatted in two columns. Each paragraph did not exceed 15 lines, contained a minimum of 3 sentences, and included at least 1 citation. Terminology and measurements were adapted to International standards. The Introduction contained 4 main points:

Paragraph 1: a description of the background explaining why the research was conducted, problem formulation, and information related to the writing.

Paragraph 2: references to previous research.

Paragraph 3: gaps based on previous research.

Paragraph 4: objectives, novelty, and benefits of the research.

METHODS

This section contained the research design, description of research implementation methods including population and sample, data collection techniques, instruments, and data analysis techniques. Results presented data characteristics and research findings. Methods were presented in sub-headings. The researchers included ethical clearance or informed consent in accordance with the subjects used.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

The results section contained brief statements about the research findings and in-depth interpretations of the findings. The

discussion section included discourse that critically connected and compared the research results with theories and previous research findings. Descriptions of research analysis results were accompanied by tables and figures. Numbering began with the letter A.

CITATIONS: Citations were written by mentioning the source, specifically by writing the author's last name accompanied by the publication year. Citations were made either directly or by summarizing.

TABLES: Table titles were written in size 10, bold. As shown in the example below. Tables were numbered using Arabic numerals. There was no space between the table title and the table. Table contents were written in Palatino font, size 10, with 1 spacing. Tables were open (without borders) with a minimum of 3 columns.

FIGURES: Figure titles were placed below the figure with the same format as table titles. Figures included the scale size. For graph figures, the base and axes were required to be black while the graph body was preferably colored. Information about figure characteristics in the form of symbols was explained in a legend, such as in the example (example of x, y graphs, and legend).

Tables and figures followed standard guidelines, referred to figures and tables in the text, and provided scale comparison information for the figures.

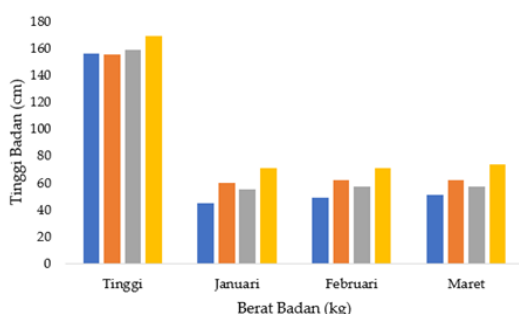


Figure 2. Height and weight measurement

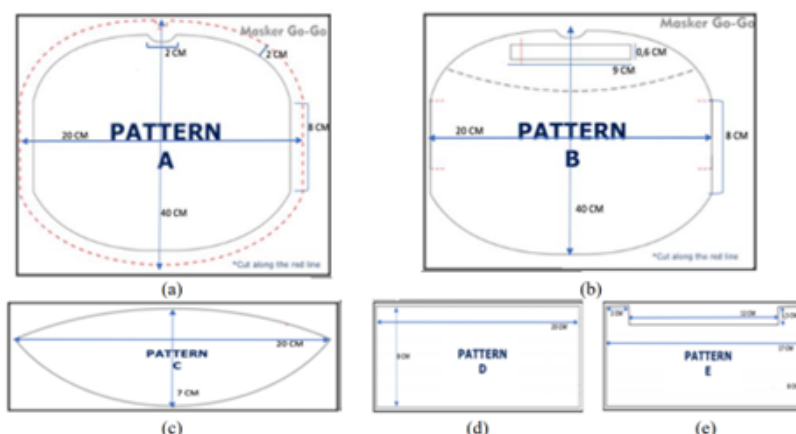


Figure 3. Pattern specifications: (a) Pattern A for fabric 1, (b) Pattern B for fabric 2, (c) Pattern C for nose and chin areas, (d) Pattern D for pocket section and (e.) Pattern E for fabric 3, specially designed to cover the mouth

The conclusion section consisted of 1 paragraph that included the achievement of research objectives and described the benefits of the research for society/knowledge development/dissemination/sustainability as well as recommendations. It was not permitted to display data analysis results in this section.

REFERENCES (11 PT, BOLD)

A minimum of 25 references comprising 80% from journal sources were required. All referenced articles

Example of formula writing:

Formulas had to be clearly legible, formula descriptions were written in paragraph form, formula writing had to include an index or sequence, formulas were left-aligned, and the index or sequence was right-aligned.

where x was Body Mass Index (BMI), a =body weight in kilograms (kg) and b = height in meters (m)

were written in the References section according to the following provisions (APA 7th): 1 space spacing was used, the second line of each article began indented with 6 keystrokes. References were written using Reference Manager (Mendeley Desktop/Zotero etc). The spacing between articles was 2 spaces. The order of article writing was based on alphabetical order of author names without numbering. Author names were written without titles, starting with the last name (family name) written in full followed by abbreviated first names. References were up to date, using references from the last 5 years with 30%

of references from the last 3 years.
