To urge the implementation of an annual Narcan training for all Risk Management Officers of
Greek Life Organizations at James Madison University.

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A BILL OF OPINION

To urge the James Madison University Office of Fraternity and Sorority Life and the Center for Multicultural Student Services to implement a Narcan training program for members of the Greek Community. We call on these offices to require all Risk Management Officers to complete drug overdose and Narcan administration training; implementing this training alongside their respective Greek councils would ensure that each organization is prepared to handle opioid-related crises and create a safer campus community.

Whereas, Opioid overdoses have dramatically increased nationally from 21,089 in 2010 to 80,411 in 2021¹, AND;

Whereas, 150 people die each day from opioid overdoses nationally², AND;

Whereas, Naloxone has been shown to be an effective emergency medication to reverse narcotic overdoses, AND;

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Whereas, The death rate of fentanyl and other synthetic opioids in the Commonwealth of Virginia has increased by 257% from 2018 to 2022³, AND;

Whereas, In 2022, 2,102 Virginians have died as a result of an opioid overdose³, AND;

Whereas, Almost eight out of 10 (79%) drug overdose deaths involve fentanyl, fentanyl analogs, and tramadol⁴, AND;

Whereas, Fentanyl is the leading cause of death for adults ages 18-45 in the United States⁵, AND;

Whereas, Studies have demonstrated a connection between Greek affiliation and drug use⁶, AND;

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Whereas, In 2022, the drug overdose death rate was 15.8 per 100,000 residents in Rockingham County and 15.0 per 100,000 residents in the City of Harrisonburg³, AND;

Whereas, Studies have indicated that “college students with naloxone training scored higher on opioid overdose risk, signs, action, and naloxone administration scales,”⁷ AND;

Whereas, Availability of overdose reversal medication does not incentivize the use of drugs, but rather provides lifesaving treatment in the event of a medical emergency, AND;

Whereas, Stigma and cost concerns have been identified as some of the primary barriers to the implementation of Narcan programs nationally⁸, AND;

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Whereas, Narcan training initiatives implemented by Syracuse University's chapter of Kappa Alpha Theta successfully trained 75 members of the organization in Narcan administration⁹, AND;

Whereas, Risk Management policy among Fraternities and Sororities at James Madison University is largely coordinated by each chapter's respective national organization rather than standardized by the university, AND;

Whereas, No buildings on the campus of James Madison University currently feature publicly accessible Naloxone for opioid overdoses, AND;

Whereas, James Madison University has stated in the Summer 2023 Strategic Plan Structure its goal to "develop and maintain the physical health of our students"¹⁰, AND:

Whereas, The ResQed student organization and Rescue Squad members are trained to conduct Narcan administration training, AND;

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Whereas, Members of ResQed have been working to train students in Narcan use and emergency response measures in recent years, AND;

Whereas, The U.S. Food and Drug Administration approved Narcan for over-the-counter distribution nationwide on March 29th, 2023¹¹, AND;

Whereas, The James Madison University Student Handbook Enlightened Citizen Amnesty Policy (ECAP) provides for amnesty from disciplinary action for “students to get help for themselves or others when alcohol or drugs are involved and medical assistance is needed”¹², AND;

Whereas, The Harrisonburg Rockingham Community Services Board provides Narcan administration kits at no cost for individuals completing *REVIVE!* training¹³, AND;

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Whereas, The Greek organizations of James Madison University often have executive officer positions for the specific purpose of each chapter's health and wellness, AND;

Whereas, These chapter officer positions are uniquely situated to manage health and safety concerns compared to other student clubs and organizations, AND;

Whereas, Members of Greek organizations represent approximately 5,000 undergraduate students¹⁴, nearly 25% of the total student body of James Madison University¹⁵, AND;

Whereas, Individuals in the Commonwealth of Virginia are immune from arrest or prosecution for drug or alcohol-related crimes when experiencing or reporting an overdose and seeking emergency medical attention through the Virginia Overdose Amnesty statute¹⁶, AND;

Whereas, Individuals who provide emergency or resuscitative treatment in good faith are protected from legal consequences through the *Virginia Good Samaritan Law*¹⁷;

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Now, therefore, be it Resolved by the Student Senate of James Madison University, That:

The Student Government Association of James Madison University requests that the Office of Fraternity & Sorority Life and the Center for Multicultural Student Services of James Madison University work alongside their constituent Greek Councils to offer greater opportunities for Naloxone training. The Student Government Association requests that the Panhellenic Council, the Interfraternity Council, and the Inter-Cultural Greek Council require all member organizations to have an officer complete a comprehensive overdose training course to remain in good standing as a member of their respective councils.

Additionally, the Student Government Association urges both university administrative bodies to assist each council in the development of a Risk Management Council to bring together Risk Management officers from each constituent organization; the focus being a more comprehensive and collaborative approach to risk management through the sharing of best practices.
