Biblical Foundation for Lifegroups

Acts 1:4-8 - "On one occasion, while he [Jesus] was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.""

Acts 2:1-4 - "When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting..."

The Place and Importance of Lifegroup

THE FIVE CIRCLES OF A HEALTHY CHURCH

Me & Jesus Life on Life House to Church Gathered Witnesses in the World

The "Five Circles Of A Healthy Church" clarifies where a person's relationship with Jesus is expressed across the church.

- ★ Lifegroups are not simply a feature or ministry of our church. They are core to everything we do as it's the primary model we see in scripture.
- ★ Our other ministry opportunities and events will rarely conflict or draw away from our Lifegroups. Instead, they will seek to integrate with and support Lifegroups as much as possible. This will never change!

Lifegroup Vision

Because Jesus loves us...

In LG we start with thankfulness and acknowledging God, the great initiator, who has revealed his love for us in Jesus. We love because he first loved us (1 Jn 4:9-19).

Questions for Leaders: Are we quick to thank God for what he's done? Is practicing thankfulness to God easy for us or difficult?

We walk with Jesus...

In LG we do this through the Word, Worship, Prayer, and being Holy Spirit led.

Questions for Leaders: Are we encountering God in the scriptures, worship, and prayer? Are these lacking or absent? Are we growing in love for Jesus keeping him at the center?

Become like Jesus...

In LG we do this by loving one another, engaging in the practices of Jesus together, and showing up consistently for our D-Group using our CORE method.

Questions for Leaders: Are we becoming more like Jesus or the world? Are we seeing the fruit and gifts of the Spirit? Do we walk out the Practices of Jesus in our lives? (Sabbath | Generosity | Hospitality | Silence & Solitude | Prayer | Service | Witness)

Help others follow Him...

In LG we do this through regular prayer for others, sharing the gospel via our testimonies, and practicing intentional hospitality by making room for people.

Questions for Leaders: Is our group more inward or outward focused? Are we regularly practicing hospitality by inviting others in?

Together.

In LG we do this through consistently **showing up** for **weekly gatherings**, **breaking bread** in and out of LG, **sharing life events**, and **meeting one another's needs**.

Questions for Leaders: Is our group committed to showing up? What obstacles get in the way? Does our group feel they have ownership of / something to contribute to LG?

What's the Result of This?

1. The Fruit of the Spirit is Produced

- We are meant to bear much fruit! Jn 15:4-9
- The Fruit of the Spirit Galatians 5:22-25 A community characterized by...

Love | Joy | Peace | Patience | Kindness Goodness | Faithfulness | Gentleness | Self-control

2. A Sense of Belonging is Cultivated

- Being a part of a community that experiences the fruit of the Spirit is the way we were meant to live in the garden. It's a foretaste of heaven.
- Living in the Kingdom of God, the Family of God, leads to maturity, growth, and depth of relationship when we are committed to showing up.
- Conflict happens...and WHEN it does (not IF) it provides an opportunity to walk out gospel
 principles of how we are called to love one another within a committed community. Many
 people are used to relationships being destroyed by conflict, but in a healthy Christian
 community, we are called to walk out and experience something wholly different. This is
 often the way God matures us most deeply and profoundly.
- Belonging is then felt even more profoundly and deeply after resolving conflict or loving one another through/despite disagreement. We get to live out the gospel...being truly known as we give and receive love despite our failures, sins, and shortcomings.

3. Multiplication, Planting, and Sending Happens.

- We are the Salt of the earth, his witnesses in the world. As we witness to others, they will be drawn into the kingdom of God.
- "The Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved."
- This can be a painful part of community as change is sometimes uncomfortable. However, without multiplication or growth, a healthy group will, over time, begin to stagnate. We are called to be a <u>consistent</u> community AND to be an <u>invitational</u> community. We have a <u>mission</u> to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ and bring others in. (Matthew 28:18-20)
- The next generation of followers of Jesus will see us loving others, sharing the gospel, and living a life on mission. There is no substitute for kids seeing the gospel lived out!

3. REVIEW STRUCTURE & PRACTICALS


Discipleship Groups

3-5 people of the same gender practicing simple yet powerful spiritual disciplines of C.O.R.E.

- Confession
- Others (prayer focused on others, especially the lost)
- Reading Scripture
- Encouragement

Why C.O.R.E. and how do I structure the time?

- These practices and disciplines are some of the most neglected in the lives of Christians.
- Through the power of the Holy Spirit, they will produce and multiply good fruit in our lives if we submit to them regularly, authentically, and within community.
- They are kingdom values...counter-cultural in just about every way. Propelling us upstream, against the relentless drag of cultural currents, toward becoming like Jesus.



Lifegroup Prayer, Planning, & Delegation

Prayer

To love and lead out God's strength, we must consistently pray for our Lifegroup with our co-leaders.

- What does this look like in your leadership team?

Planning & Delegation

Planning and delegation help us partner with Jesus and make him the center. When all members of the body are engaged in using their gifts, the body of Christ builds itself up in love.

Planning ahead and delegating roles in Lifegroup can be difficult at first. When we are short on time or feel like asking others is a burden on them, we will default to doing things ourselves. Over time though, this will not be healthy for you as the leader or for the Lifegroup.

When we pray, plan, and delegate responsibilities in the Lifegroup we're giving people opportunity to grow in their own giftings!

Best practices:

- Cast vision for the roles of LG (makedisciples.co for document)
- Assign people to the responsibilities on a rotation (don't do sign-ups)
- Coach them as they lead. Give encouragement and feedback to help them grow.

The Structure of Lifegroup

Fellowship — 10 to 30 mins

Welcome one another as God in Christ has welcomed you! (Rom 15:7) This is intentional time to greet every person and visit with one another. Seek to include others in your conversations. A snack and water are standard practice.

Vision / Honor — 5 to 10 mins

Casting vision = setting expectations! Never skip it and always answer these questions: Why are we here? Why is it important? What are we doing? Vision should be understood by kids too, but don't make it so simple it lacks impact.

• Honor - Take a moment to honor someone here! Recognize a b-day, encourage someone, etc. What we celebrate we recreate. This builds a culture of encouragement. Be aware of time though, this can go long!

Worship — 10 to 30 mins

Lead the LG into the presence of God. <u>Always make it about Jesus</u> whether singing to live worship or a playlist of Sunday songs, reading Psalms together, or praying out loud what we're thankful for. <u>Always</u> reduce distractions (volume, unknown lyrics, etc.) and <u>give clear instructions</u> so people know how to participate.

• Kids in Worship - include them but don't allow them to be wild. Worship through dancing and singing is welcome, but climbing on the coffee table, wrestling on the ground, or screaming is not. Be kind as you correct, but also very firm and <u>consistent</u> on this, ask parents to help!

Word & Discussion / Kids Lesson — 30 to 45 mins

Engage with the Word of God together. The Holy Spirit uses the word to guide, correct, rebuke, form, and shape us into people who love, speak and act like Jesus. Kids 8 and up may participate, be sure content/topic is appropriate.

Kids Lesson (7 and under) - This is when the kids and Kids Leaders go to another area to lead their lesson!
 This is discipleship of the next generation and an integral part of our family Lifegroups! This can also be more challenging than other roles in LG! Pray beforehand for your heart to be in the right place.

Prayer & Ministry / Kids Playtime - 15 to 30 mins

Go to God directly and minister to one another. The Holy Spirit brings conviction and change on a heart level and he uses us to minister to and encourage one another. Kids 8 and up participate unless needs dictate otherwise.

• Kids Playtime - This isn't the "non-spiritual" part of LG for kids. Play is how kids build lasting friendships, learn to share, relate to others, respect boundaries, include others, and have fun! Shepherd this time well: play with them, resolve conflict, and enforce house rules. Unwanted behavior that's unchecked can greatly impact a kid and/or adult's desire to come to LG, so stay engaged and tuned in.
