Alternate Assessment Participation Overview

Only students with the most significant cognitive disabilities may participate in the alternate assessment (Dynamic Learning Maps), and no student should take the alternate assessment unless they meet the state's definition of a student with the most significant cognitive disability. These standards promote access to the general curriculum and are expectations of what students with the most significant cognitive disabilities know and can do.

The term "the most significant cognitive disability" is not limited to the Wisconsin impairment category, "Intellectual Disabilities," but rather refers to the state definition, outlined below:

- Typically characterized as functioning at least two and a half to three standard deviations below the mean in both adaptive behavior and cognitive functioning; and
- Performs substantially below grade level expectations on the academic content standards of the grade in which they are enrolled, even with the use of adaptations and accommodations; and
- A student who requires extensive, direct individualized instruction and substantial support to achieve measurable gains, across all content areas and settings.

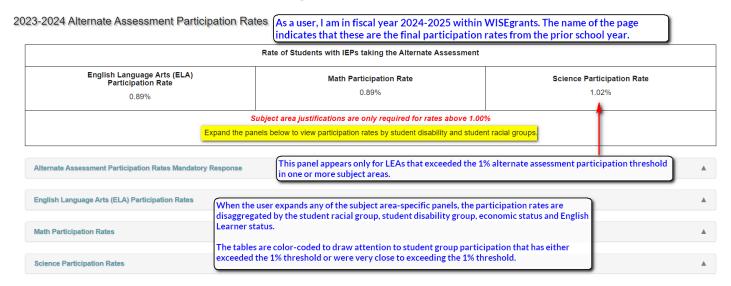
Under ESSA (the Every Student Succeeds Act - which is the reauthorization title of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act), the number of students who may take the alternate assessment is limited to no more than 1.0 percent of the total number of all students in the state who are assessed in a given subject (34 CFR §200.6(c)(2)).

All LEAs may view their alternate assessment participation rates in WISEgrants, which is DPI's web-based Federal Grants Management system. Assessments are given in the spring of each year and the results submitted to DPI over the summer. Participation rates are determined in the fall, after the close of the previous school year. To view the prior spring participation rates, the LEA would access the report in the current fiscal year. As an example, the participation rate results of the spring 2025 assessments are available in WISEgrants fiscal year 2025-2026.

When the user enters the Alternate Assessment Participation Rates page, the results will always be from the prior spring (fiscal year). When the user expands any of the subject area-specific panels, the participation rates are disaggregated by student racial group, student disability group, economic and English Learner status. The tables within the panels are color-coded to draw attention to student group participation that has either exceeded the 1% threshold or were very close to exceeding the 1% threshold.

This is an example of the ELA panel expanded to show alternate assessment participation rates, disaggregated by student group, under ELA:

If any of the three subject areas exceeded the 1% participation rate threshold, the LEA will be required to submit a justification for why the rate was exceeded in that subject area as well as information on how professional development will be provided to IEP members on the definition of most significant cognitive disability and how alternate assessment participation is determined.
