The first page should contain only the title, the authors' names and affiliations, and the author's e-mail address in the language chosen for the article (French or English). However, the abstract and keywords must be in both French and English.

The abstract must include the aim of the study, the methodology used and the main results obtained.

Please note that the first paragraph of a section or subsection should not be indented, neither should the first paragraph following a table, figure, equation, etc. Subsequent paragraphs, however, should be indented by 0, 5cm. The full extended abstract should ideally contain four sections and references, and a maximum of four pages. The first page should contain only the title, the names and affiliations of the authors, the abstract in English and French, and the keywords in English and French.

The equations are centred and on a separate line. They are produced using Microsoft Equation Editor and provided in editable form in the text. Number the equations consecutively and add a tab to the number to the end of the line, between the brackets. The equations are referred to in the text by these numbers.



Figures are cited in the text without an abbreviation Figure 1, Figures 2-4, 6, 8a, b. If they are cited in brackets, they must be cited with an abbreviation (Fig. 1, Figs. 2-4, 8a, b)

Tables should be placed close the first reference in the text and numbered consecutively. Abbreviations should be avoided in column headings. Units should be given in the line immediately below the title.

The table is quoted in the text without the abbreviation Table 1. If it is cited in brackets, it must be cited with an abbreviation (Tab. 1).
