Houses wrecked in Pleasant-wood, Kentucky, three miles from the centre of Birmingham, by a whirlwind of extraordinary fury yesterday.









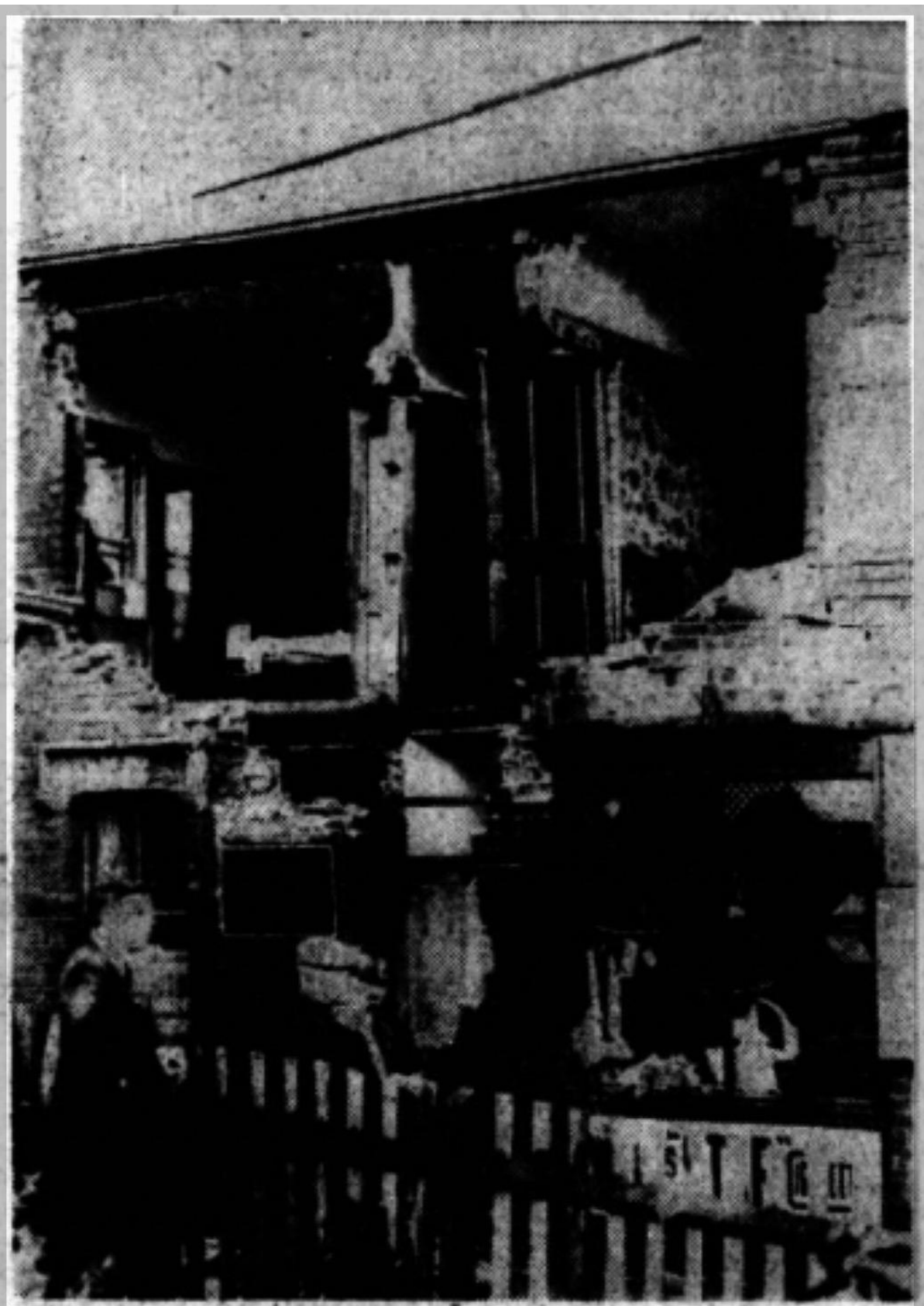

The house in Formans-road, Sparkhill, [Birmingham](#), outside which an elderly woman was buried under falling brickwork and killed.

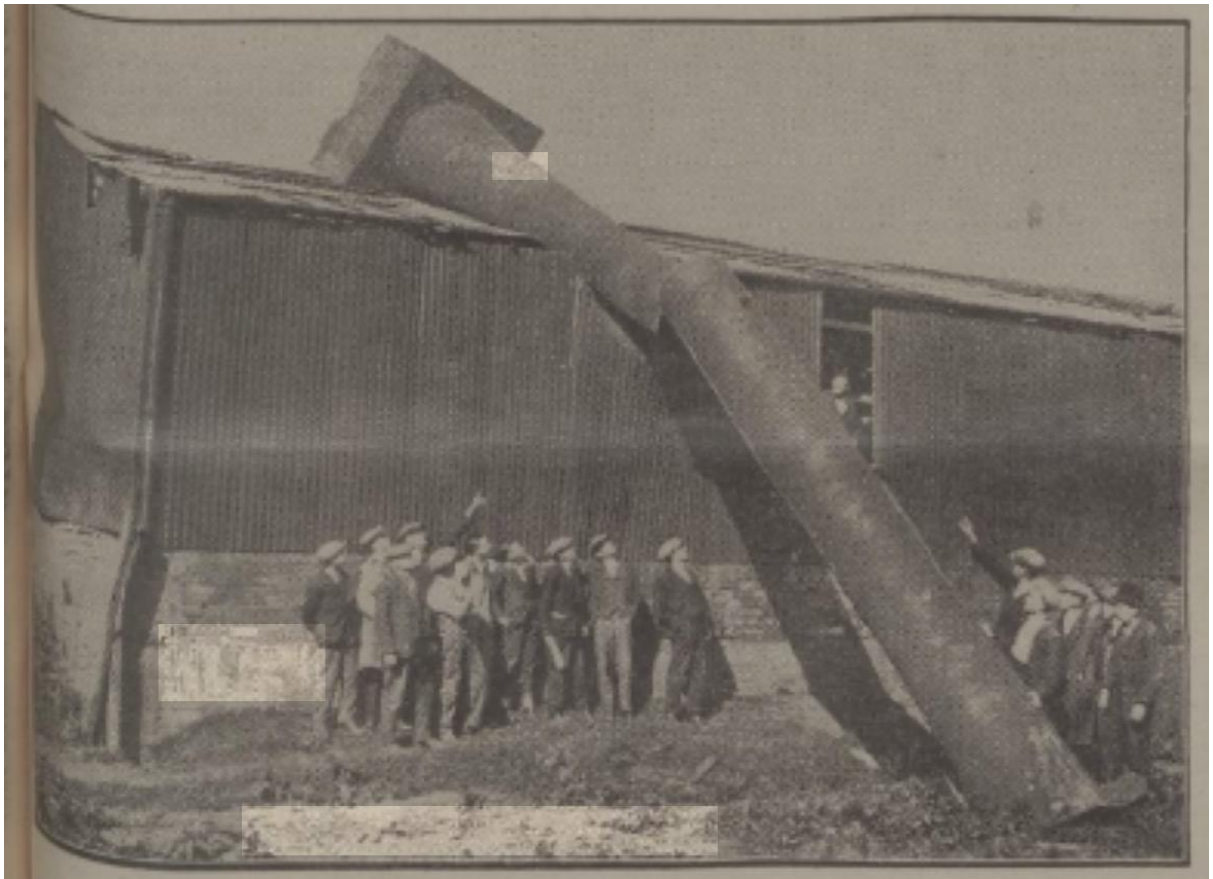
