 - a. HB58- Positive Behavior Plan
 - i. Explained the state passed the HB58, funding to have programs in schools to help
 - ii. Safe and Healthy Choices- similar to Red Ribbon Week, just a way to help students know that we are working towards Safe and Healthy Choices week
 - iii. Individual and Group Counseling/Social Work Services
 - iv. Bi Weekly Counselor lessons in classrooms
 - v. Wellness Room- to help students calm down and recognize when support is needed and then return to class

- vi. Botvin Life Skills- Lessons taught to 5th grade by counselor to make good choices.
- vii. Looking for feedback on assemblies to promote positive and motivational ideas for students, conversation for families in a jar where they families can pull out ideas for conversations with family members at home, emotions posters in each classrooms that are age appropriate for grade levels, Little Spot Curriculum, Sources of Strength Curriculum, Calm Boxes, Behavior Tracking and Support, Prevent Child Abuse Utah
- viii. Ideas from parents: mindfulness activity night with families to help teach families way to work through things- mentioned possibly combining these with Title One activities and/or PTA nights, also Carli asked for any additional ideas that they could contact her

b. PCAU
