

Peer Feedback Stems and Frames for Multilingual Learners

The table below demonstrates ways in which you can support all students, including especially multilingual learners, with peer feedback. The TAG protocol, in which learners use co-constructed success criteria to "Tell" something their partner did well, "Ask" a question related to the learning intention, and "Give" a suggestion, is a powerful way to structure feedback between peers. In this case, students can engage in either English or Spanish, but the same thinking can be adapted to any language.
