Research Interests

- **Romantic Relationships:** What are the warning signs of a potentially violent relationship? How do current victims and survivors of relationship violence view their partner and the relationship? What variables predict whether a relationship will continue over time? What cognitive biases affect perceptions in all romantic relationships?
- **Dynamic Gender and Sexual Stereotypes:** How do present-day individuals perceive that men and women have changed over time, and how do they evaluate these perceived changes? What effect do these views have on opportunities for non-binary or gender-queer individuals? More generally, how do we react to a social group seen as changing, versus one seen as stable? What drives heterosexism, homophobia, and transphobia?
- **Cult Dynamics:** What makes a group qualify as a “cult”? Do cult leaders share common psychological traits or characteristics? How do cults manipulate people into joining the group, and how do they indoctrinate members? How does being in a cult affect one’s morality and sense of self? What is the process of escape and healing?
- **Psychology in Popular Culture:** How does popular culture reflect stereotypes and social roles, and how can psychological topics be seen within media messages, movies, and TV shows? When psychological concepts are portrayed, is the portrayal accurate? What effect do these portrayals have on the typical viewer and on the field of psychology as a whole?
