
Course Length: Semester

# **Requirements:**

### **Course Description:**

Designed as a school-day intervention/enrichment period,
"Patriot Block" provides all PHS students with the opportunity

#### **Course Outcomes/Power Standards:**

This intervention course has been designed to provide students with opportunities to develop and apply critical reading and thinking skills through guided, shared, and independent reading. During Literacy Support, students receive intensive instruction aligned to the Common Core State Standards in reading comprehension, vocabulary development, and oral reading fluency. The instructional focus is on specific strategies and skills that students will be able to apply to all content areas. Students will also be exposed to a variety of genres, including high-interest fiction and nonfiction texts, magazines, newspapers, online materials and test preparation. The goal of the Literacy Support is not only to increase the student's reading proficiency but also to increase their motivation and engagement with the entire reading process. This course is a literacy intervention provided to students as a follow-up to the reading screening assessment (STAR) administered three times a year to all students in grades 9-12. It is offered during a portion of a student's Patriot Block. Students who require this intervention are identified using a set of decision rules created by the interventionists.

#### Course Expectations (Attendance, Participation, & Preparation):

<u>Participation/Preparation for Class</u>: In order for students to find success in patriot block, students are expected to come prepared for class with their notebook, charged Chromebook, pen/pencil, calculator, and any other supplies required for class.



Attendance: Students are expected to attend all classes and will have greater success in doing so. Attendance will be taken each class. YOU are responsible for making arrangements to get notes, assignments, directions, or announcements for missed classes. YOU are still responsible for completing weekly assignments and expectations, whether present or absent. <u>Course Communication:</u> Some methods for class communication will be through personal conversation, school email, Aspen, and Google Classroom. The best way to contact the teacher is through use of these methods. Messages and/or assignments may be posted in Google Classroom or on support platforms. For this reason, students should check Google Classroom regularly.

<u>Course Incompletes:</u> Incompletes are not common practice. In the event that an incomplete must be given the student, teacher, school counselor, and guardian(s) will collaboratively come up with a dated plan that outlines the necessary steps for course completion. **Electronic Devices:** During the accelerated learning portion of Patriot Block, your attention should be focused only on the invention/enrichment platform, instructional videos (if needed), and taking notes. As such, using electronic devices other than your intervention platform is prohibited (no music). However, during self-directed learning, you may access other tabs or technology to assist with your work completion and focus. That being said, the teacher reserves the right to have any student put away an electronic device that is determined to be disrupting your learning or the learning of others. <u>Academic Dishonesty:</u> It is paramount that you do your own work; provide appropriate references to all assignments; and abide by the Portsmouth High School academic honesty policy. # **Grading:**

"Patriot Block" is a credit-bearing class (0.5 credits per semester) and is graded on a "Pass/Fail" scale. Each week, students will be graded on a 10-point rubric based on work completion, notetaking, and overall engagement in the learning process.

#### **Grading Scale:**

A passing grade for this course will be an average of 65. This course will be reported as Pass/Fail on all transcripts.
