Program Description

The Associate in Aviation Management program with a Specialization in Faith-Based Air Transport and Humanitarian Aid is designed to prepare students for entry-level roles in the aviation industry with a focus on mission-driven service. This program combines technical knowledge of aviation logistics and management with a biblical framework for humanitarian service and global outreach.

Students will explore the fundamentals of aviation operations, airport and flight logistics, aviation safety, and faith-based humanitarian response planning. Through both classroom study and applied learning, students will develop the skills to assist in aviation ministries, disaster relief efforts, and non-profit transportation services.

Graduates will be equipped to support logistics in mission organizations, serve in aviation outreach programs, or continue studies in aviation science, logistics, or nonprofit management.

- Designing a flight logistics plan for a mission trip.
- Creating a disaster response strategy using air transport.
- Partnering with an aviation ministry to assist with real-time operations.

- Apply Christian ethics to global transport and humanitarian coordination.
- Collaborate in mission-based aviation and relief planning.
- Communicate effectively in technical and cross-cultural ministry settings.
- Pursue roles in aviation nonprofits or further studies in aviation science.
