

Evaluation, grading, and learning activities

Evaluation

Ordinary session

The final evaluation grade will be the sum of the following activities:

- Weblog. 20% of final grade. Personal contribution to the thematic group blog: at least 6 entries should be posted during the semester
- Practicals. 30% of final grade. Six hands-on exercises will be conducted in class under the supervision of an instructor. **Maximum grade 10, minimum to pass the class, 5.**
- Final Project. 30% of final grade. Group-work: design, development and presentation of a functional multimedia project. **Maximum grade 10, minimum to pass the class, 5.**
- Midterm exam. 20% of final grade. **Maximum grade 10, minimum to pass the class, 5.** In case of failure, one must take the final exam.

The practicals, the final project and the exam will be evaluated separately. In case a student doesn't reach the minimum grade in any of these three subjects, that specific subject will be considered as failed.

Extraordinary session

Students will be able to repeat the failed subjects in an extraordinary session as follows:

- Theory: written exam on the established bibliography and topics covered in class.
- Practicals: realization of exercises 1 to 6.
- Final project: development of a personal project following the given guidelines.

Anyone who does not achieve the minimum grade in one part can re-submit the work or retake the exam in the Convocatoria extraordinaria. Any of the three parts already passed will not have to be repeated.

Learning activities

In person (46 hours)

- Students will attend 8 lectures during which the topics of the course will be discussed. Students will take notes and take part in the debates, discussions and other activities during classes. (Lectures: 16 hours).
- Students will attend 7 practice sessions and produce a series of six exercises. (Practicals: 14 hours).
- Students will develop a final project in groups, which will be monitored in 6 phases, according to the established guidelines (Guided work: 12 hours).

- Students will periodically consult the professor in charge of their practice turn to solve issues, revise their work and check the progress of the final project. (Tutorials, 2 hours)
- Students will take a midterm exam, and – in case of failure – an individual final exam. (Exams: 4 hours)

Out of class (84 hours)

- Students will be divided into working groups. All through the course, each group will create and manage a thematic blog on which each student will post at least 6 entries during the semester, according to the assignments. (Directed work: 14 hours)
- During 6 weeks, students will produce in groups the contents of the final project. (Directed work: 40 hours)
- Students will be asked to study the required bibliography and the notes that will be taken during the theoretical lectures. Students will also consult the complementary bibliography, as well as the online documents that will be suggested during the course, to complete the study of the topics. Student will also visit and explore the websites and online references that will be indicated during the classes and on the webpage of the course. (Personal study: 30 hours)
