"The Beaver Run Hunting and Fishing Club is dedicated to the propagation, protection and conservation of game, fish and wildlife." The club expects both members and guests to observe club rules regarding fishing and hunting as well as the fish and game laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The club also expects both members and guests to practice good sportsmanship, proper hunting and fishing etiquette and firearms safety.

Beaver Run maintains a property in the Pocono Mountains of Northeastern Pennsylvania consisting of approximately 940 acres. The Beaver Run Lake is a mile in length and is fed by the Bushkill Creek and the Beaver Run Creek. Ten large trout pools formed by large boulders are located just north of the lake on the Bushkill Creek. The Beaver Run Creek first merges into a three-acre trout pond before

entering the main lake. Both the stream and the trout pond are regularly stocked throughout the trout fishing season. A large fly-fishing pool located just below the Beaver Run Dam is also sometimes stocked with trout.

There are many nature trails and dirt roads to accommodate the hikers and certainly photographers. Wildlife abounds everywhere one looks. Commonly seen are deer, beaver, otter, turkeys, ducks, blue heron and a variety of other waterfowl, including the American Bald Eagle.

Also included on the club grounds are a rifle and pistol target range located just north of the trout pond. A new pavilion sits to the left and behind the clubhouse, providing an exciting and relaxing view down the lake. Adjacent to the pavilion is the trap shooting range which is also lighted for night shooting.

### **Clubhouse & Facilities**

The main floor of the clubhouse features a common room which sports rich wooden floors and walls, hefty wooden main support beams overhead, a stone fireplace, a large bow window overlooking the lake, French doors leading to a screened porch off of the front of the clubhouse and comfortable furniture for your relaxation.

The main entrance room features the same rich, wood floors, ceilings and walls as well as crafted lockers for members personal belongings. The room also has a large, round table and chairs for socializing and an entrance table used for snacks and beverages for your enjoyment.

The game room features the same wood appearance and contains a very old slate top pool table, electronic dart board and a rack for storage of guns and hunting gear. A half bath is also located off this room.

The dining room has a carpeted floor and an acoustic ceiling seating 50 people comfortably at large, cloth covered tables. Mealtimes are traditionally 8:15 a.m., 1:00 p.m., and 6:00 p.m. Meals at Beaver Run are prepared by our stewards. The menu features salads, a main course of beef, poultry, veal or pork, homemade stews, soups and sautéed dishes, fresh vegetable sides, rolls and biscuits, desserts and baked goods. A bell will be rung one half hour prior to each mealtime followed by a second bell announcing the meal.

The upper level of the clubhouse features men's and ladies' rooms, each complete with vanities, showers and toilets. In addition, there are 14 bedrooms, each sleeping from 2 to 5. All bedding, linens and towels are furnished. You are responsible for your own toiletries, but shower and hand soaps are provided.

\*\*Three meals a day will be served **BUT** you are encouraged to bring your own beverages and snack foods for your personal enjoyment.
