2 Types of Remainders Vested Remainders:

1- given to ascertained person (named) AND

2- is not subject to condition precedent (NOT natural death)

-- if person ascertained AND follow natural death --> vested.

Otherwise --> Contingent Remainders

To A for life, then B and his heirs

A - life estate

B - vested remainder in fee simple

(B is ascertained, no condition precedent).

From O (and his heirs) To A for life, then to B's children (and their heirs)
B is childless
O has reversion
Future interest - contingent remainder in fee simple for the children

From O to A for life, then B's children

B has a child, named C.

1 - ascertained (c)

2 - no condition precedent, natural

--> vested remainder subject to open

O reversion in fee simple

To A for life, then to B and her heirs if B marries during A's lifetime

Present = life estate in A

Future = B has a contingent

remainder in fee simple (B is ascertained, Condition precedent = marriage)

O = reversion

O conveys Blackacare to A for life, then to B if B gives A a proper funeral."

A = present interest, life estate
