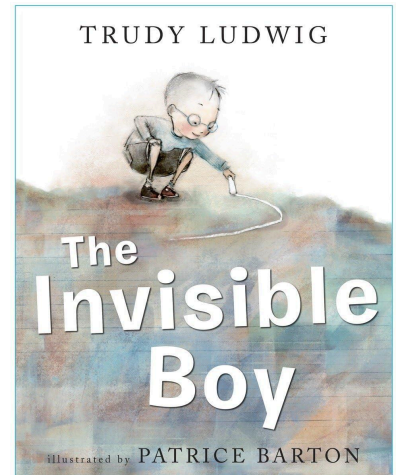


“The Invisible Boy”
