  crime. White autoworkers Ronald Ebens and Michael Nitz fatally beat him with a baseball bat. Vincent Chin's life and
  the legal struggle for justice that followed his murder inspired the development Pan-Asian American community
  organizing in Detroit.

Out of the 1,421 submissions, the winner was Yale undergrad Maya Lin. Despite winning, Lin faced discrimination as a young Chinese American woman. Her memorial design was still used and has since been deemed a powerful and important piece of American history. Lin went on in her career to design many more memorials, buildings, and sculptures, many of which incorporate her views on environmentalism.

- Our figure for AAPI Heritage Month is Ellison Onizuka. Ellison Onizuka was the first Asian American and the first person of Japanese origin to fly in space. As a NASA astronaut, engineer, and test pilot for the Air Force, he passed his first mission in 1985 on the Space Shuttle Discovery. He was a part of NASA's Astronaut Class of 1978, which was known as the 35 New Guys. It was the first astronaut class in almost a decade that included women, Hispanics, and Asian and African Americans. Before becoming an astronaut, Onizuka was a colonel in the United States Air Force, where he served as a flight test engineer and as a test pilot. He also attended the US Air Force Test Pilot School, where he registered over 1,700 flight hours. Onizuka also received a variety of awards for his accomplishments such as the Air Force Commendation Medal, Air Force Meritorious Service Medal, and the National Defense Service Medal.

Forces for 23 years before retiring at the rank of Lieutenant Colonel in 2014. She got elected to the U.S. Senate in 2016 after representing Illinois's Eighth Congressional District in the U.S. House of Representatives and has served 2 terms." In the Senate, Duckworth advocates for practical solutions that are required to move the country forward, such as rebuilding infrastructure.

His monograph Binh Danh: The Enigma of Belonging was the inaugural recipient of the Minami Book Grant for Asian American Visual Artists at Radius Books in 2023.
