Job Title: Special Educational Needs Coordinator (SENCO) - Key Stage 1

#### **Job Overview:**

Identify, monitor and assist pupils with special educational needs.

### **Job Summary:**

The SENCO will play a crucial role in ensuring that all students, particularly those with special educational needs, receive the support and accommodations necessary to achieve their full potential.

**Reports to:** Vice-Principal

### **Key Accountabilities:**

- Assist the Vice-Principal in identifying pupils special educational needs.
- Demonstrate and monitor effective differentiation in the classroom.
- Identify and assess pupils deemed to have special educational needs (to include gifted pupils).
- Draw up, monitor and implement Individual Education Plans (IEP) for targeted children.
- Coordinate regular IEP review meetings.
- Identify and access outside agencies where applicable.
- Manage resources related to special educational needs.
- Initiate and/or take part in staff training and special needs awareness programs.

## **Key Responsibilities:**

#### 1. Identification and Assessment:

- Collaborate with teachers and other professionals to identify students with special educational needs (SEN) in Key Stage 1.
- Conduct thorough assessments to understand the specific needs and challenges of individual students.

#### 2. Individual Education Plans (IEPs):

• Develop and implement Individual Education Plans for students with SEN, outlining specific goals, strategies, and accommodations.

• Regularly review and update IEPs in consultation with teachers, parents, and external support services.

## 3. Teacher Support and Training:

• Provide guidance and support to Key Stage 1 teachers in implementing effective strategies for inclusive teaching and adapting the curriculum to meet the diverse needs of students.

## 4. Monitoring and Evaluation:

- Regularly monitor the progress of students with SEN, adjusting support strategies as needed.
- Collect and analyze data related to the effectiveness of SEN interventions and programs.

# 5. Professional Development:

- Stay informed about current trends and best practices in special education.
- Provide training and professional development opportunities for staff to enhance their understanding of SEN and inclusive teaching practices.

### 6. Parental Engagement:

 Maintain open and effective communication with parents/guardians, keeping them informed about their child's progress and involving them in the decision-making process.
