

"God's Spirit Is Moving Through the Streets Like a Tornado"

Discussion Guide: Inspired By Pastor Emeritus George Dailey

Day 1: The God Who Never Changes

Devotional

There are moments in life when everything around us feels uncertain. Relationships shift. Health declines. Circumstances spiral. And in those moments, we desperately need something solid to hold onto. Here is the good news. God is not shifting with your circumstances. He is the same God who healed the sick in Jerusalem, opened prison doors for the apostles, and raised the dead back to life. That same God is present with you right now, today, in whatever you are facing. This is not wishful thinking. It is a settled truth rooted in Scripture. Because God does not change, His power does not expire. Because He is the same, His promises still stand. What He did then, He can do now. What He spoke over His people in Scripture, He is still speaking over you. You do not have to wonder if God is still in the business of moving. He is. His Spirit is still active, still healing, still restoring, still showing up in the middle of impossible situations. The same power that swept through the streets of Jerusalem is available to you today. Let that truth settle deep in your heart. You are not serving a God of the past. You are walking with a God who is fully present, fully powerful, and fully committed to you right now.

Bible Verse

"For I am the Lord, I change not." - Malachi 3:6

Reflection Question

If you truly believed God is the same today as He was in Scripture, how would that change the way you approach your current situation?

Quote

"God is still the same yesterday, today and forever. Isn't that right, somebody? He is still working miracles."

Prayer

Lord, thank You for being a God who never changes. Help me to anchor my hope not in my circumstances, but in who You are. Let that truth be the foundation I stand on today.

Day 2: Faith That Moves

Devotional

Faith is not a feeling. It is a decision. Think about the woman with the issue of blood. She had been suffering for twelve years. She had spent everything she had. She was exhausted, broke, and out of options. But when she heard Jesus was near, something rose up inside her. She did not say, "I might be healed" or "I hope something happens." She made a declaration. She pressed through the crowd. She reached out and touched the hem of His garment, and she was made whole. That kind of faith is not passive. It does not sit back and wait for a feeling to arrive before it acts. It moves. It presses. It reaches. It is anchored in what God has already said, not in what the situation looks like. Maybe you have been waiting a long time for something to change. Maybe you are tired of pressing and not seeing results. But do not give up. The woman did not stop short of Jesus. She kept moving until she got to Him. Your faith does not have to be loud or dramatic. It just has to be real and directed toward the right Person. Press in today. Reach out. God is closer than you think, and He responds to faith that moves.

Bible Verse

"And a woman having an issue of blood twelve years, which had spent all her living upon physicians, neither could be healed of any, came behind him, and touched the border of his garment: and immediately her issue of blood stancheth." - Luke 8:43-44

Reflection Question

Is there an area in your life where you have been waiting passively instead of pressing forward in active faith?

Quote

"She didn't say I might be, I reckon. But she said, I will be made whole. Oh, God. Oh, that's faith."

Prayer

Jesus, give me the kind of faith that moves. Help me to press through doubt, fear, and discouragement and reach out to You with confidence today.

Day 3: Act on What He Says

Devotional

Faith without action is incomplete. When Jesus approached the man who had been lying at the pool of Bethesda for 38 years, He did not simply speak healing over Him from a distance. He gave him an instruction. Rise, take up your bed, and walk. The man had to do something before he saw the miracle. He had to act on the word before the evidence showed up. This is how God often works. He speaks, and then He waits to see if we will trust Him enough to move. The miracle is connected to the obedience. Not because we earn healing by doing the right things, but because faith that is

real will always produce action. Maybe God has already spoken something over your life. Maybe He has given you a direction, a step, a word. And you are still waiting for more confirmation before you move. But sometimes the confirmation comes after the step, not before it. You do not need to have everything figured out. You just need to trust the One who is asking you to move. He would not ask you to do something He has not already equipped you for. Take the step. Act on what He has said. The miracle is waiting on the other side of your obedience.

Bible Verse

"Jesus saith unto Him, Rise, take up thy bed, and walk. And immediately the man was made whole, and took up his bed, and walked." - John 5:8-9

Reflection Question

Is there a step of faith God has been asking you to take that you have been hesitating on, and what is holding you back?

Quote

"Jesus could have picked Him up just like that, couldn't He? But he said, take out your bed. You do that now. Pick up your bed and walk. God told Him what to do. Now use your faith."

Prayer

Father, give me the courage to act on Your word even before I see the results. Help me to trust that You are faithful to complete what You have started in my life.

Day 4: Obedience Is the Key

Devotional

We can do a lot of things that look like faith. We can attend every service, sing every song, and quote every verse. But if obedience is missing, something essential is missing. God made a promise to the Israelites in Exodus 15. He told them plainly: if you obey My voice and follow Me, I will not put these diseases upon you. The promise was real, but it was connected to a condition. Obedience was the key that unlocked it. This is not about earning God's favor through perfect behavior. It is about positioning yourself to receive what He has already promised. Obedience is how we say with our lives that we actually believe what we claim to believe. It is the proof that our faith is more than words. Think about the areas of your life where God has been asking you to trust Him more fully. Maybe it is in how you treat others. Maybe it is in a habit you have been holding onto. Maybe it is in a relationship or a financial decision. Whatever it is, obedience in that area is not a burden. It is a doorway. God is not trying to make your life harder. He is trying to lead you into something better. Trust His voice. Follow where He leads. Obedience is where the blessing lives.

Bible Verse

"And said, If thou wilt diligently hearken to the voice of the Lord thy God, and wilt do that which is right in his sight, and wilt give ear to his commandments, and keep all His statutes, I will put none of these diseases upon thee, which I have brought upon the Egyptians: for I am the Lord that healeth thee." - Exodus 15:26

Reflection Question

Where in your life is God asking for obedience, and what would it look like to fully surrender that area to Him today?

Quote

"Obedience is better than sacrifice. We can jump shot, run, Holly kick all we want to. We don't obey, speak in tongues, preach hard. Make a tune sound good. If you're not obedient, it don't mean nothing to God."

Prayer

Lord, I want to be someone who not only hears Your word but acts on it. Show me where I have been holding back, and give me the strength to walk in full obedience to You.

Day 5: It Is Well

Devotional

One of the most powerful things you can say in the middle of a storm is this: it is well. The Shunammite woman in Scripture knew what it meant to face the unthinkable. Her son had died. And yet, when asked if everything was alright, she said it is well. Not because she was in denial. Not because she did not feel the weight of her grief. But because she knew who God was, and she trusted Him more than she trusted what she could see. That declaration was not weakness. It was one of the strongest acts of faith recorded in Scripture. She was saying, God, I do not understand this. But I trust You. And God responded. Her son was raised back to life. You may be in a season right now where things are not well on the surface. Maybe it is your health, your family, your finances, or your peace of mind. But you can still make the declaration. Not as a denial of your pain, but as a statement of trust in a God who is bigger than your problem. Saying it is well does not mean you pretend everything is fine. It means you choose to anchor your confidence in God's character rather than your current circumstances. He has not forgotten you. He has not changed. And He is still more than able.

Bible Verse

"Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever." - Hebrews 13:8

Reflection Question

What would it look like for you to declare "it is well" in the area of your life that feels the most uncertain right now?

Quote

"Saying it is well in the middle of suffering is not denial. It is a declaration of trust that God is bigger than the problem."

Prayer

God, even when I do not understand what I am walking through, I choose to trust You. Help me to declare that it is well, not because everything is perfect, but because You are faithful and You never change.
