Historical Significance: documentation of the historical and cultural significance of each site. Including information about their history, cultural context, and any notable events associated with them.

2. Community Support and Commitment: Involvement of the local community, cultural organisations, historians, and experts. This may include petition signatures or letters of support from the community and families of these businesses.

3. Authorities: Local Government officials, cultural Authorities, and national heritage preservation agencies. With their help a map can be created as a guideline that connects these cultural sites. Accessibility, distance, and any natural features that the Public Authorities can improve the experience of all of these will be considered.

4. Tourism and the Economic Impact: The Heritage Trail will benefit the local economy through increased quality tourism and cultural awareness. This will guarantee such unique gems to continue to thrive. Unfortunately every Government and every Council has not been fully committed to helping these aspects of heritage that have been passed down from generation to generation.

5. Additional Privacy Concerns: Every area of Valletta forms part Historical value, whilst we do appreciate that large interest and promotion of our city we do wish to address persistent concerns delivered to us by residents, and implement sets of regulations which Tour Groups would need to respect in order to minimise disruption within residential areas such as lowering down loudspeakers, minimise overcrowding of pavements followed by respecting private limits of each resident.

6. Advertisement and Incentives: We insist that every authority, department, event will be committed to advertisement and creating special funds such as maybe start-up funds or even occasional voucher systems amongst the locals and visitors of the locality without the financial burden or sacrifice of these icons
