

Scholarships as of September 1, 2026

Nitro Scholarship (12th grade/college students and parents)

This \$2000 scholarship is awarded monthly to students or parents who are either currently enrolled as a high school senior, college student, or who is currently paying back a loan for college after graduation. Applicants must create a profile with NitroCollege. More information here:

Gates Scholarship (12th grade)

This is a highly competitive scholarship for high school seniors. It is a “last dollar” scholarship that covers all college expenses after financial aid. Applicants must be eligible for the Pell grant, be a US citizen, national or permanent resident, and be one of the following ethnicities: African-American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian or Pacific Islander American, and/or Hispanic American. Applicants must have a 3.3 minimum cumulative GPA. The ideal candidate will have outstanding academics, leadership ability, and exceptional personal success skills. Shout it Out Scholarship (ages 14 and up)

Coca-Cola Scholarship (12th grade)

This \$20,000 scholarship is available for high school seniors with at least a 3.0 minimum cumulative GPA. Applicants must be one of the following: US citizen, US national, permanent resident, refugee, asylee. Winners will be determined based on leadership, academics and service. AES Engineering Scholarship (12th grade)

Daniels Fund Scholarship (12th grade)

This scholarship is available to high school seniors who are graduating from a college in Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, or Wyoming. The scholarship covers all college expenses after

other financial aid and scholarships have been used. Students must demonstrate financial need, and must be a US citizen or permanent resident. Applicants should demonstrate: strength of character, leadership potential, commitment to serve their communities, academic performance or promise, well rounded personality, and emotional maturity. They should uphold the values of ethics and integrity, honesty, respect for people, loyalty and reliability, entrepreneurial spirit, patriotism and commitment to community, commitment to excellence, and etiquette. Winners are expected to participate in Daniels Scholarship Enrichment Program during college. NACME Scholarships (12th grade)

There are multiple scholarships available through the National Action Council for Minorities in Engineering (NACME), including the Chevron/Diversity scholarship which is open to incoming freshmen at specific colleges. Applicants for these scholarships should have a 2.8-3.0 cumulative GPA, be a high school senior or matriculated college student at one of the member institutions, and intend to major in engineering or computer science or related fields.
