

# Paint to Test and Price - Instructions

## Supplies

- ☐ Paper towels
- ☐ Paint key
- ☐ Hammer
- ☐ Skewers & toothpicks (5-6)

## Instructions

### 1. Macro Sort

- a. Check the integrity of each container - if paint is in a degrading container or the contents are unknown, dispose of in Resource Recovery.
- b. Check remaining containers for the words “Vapor Harmful” or “Vapor is Harmful” or equivalent language on the label. These must be tested outside by a volunteer over the age of 18.

### 2. Sort into the following categories:

- Craft Acrylic Paint
- Artist Acrylic Paint
- Tempura Paint
- Craft Paint
- House Paint
- Watercolor & Gouache
- Oil Paint
- Paint Pens/ Sticks
- Fabric Paint
- Little Paint Pots
- Bingo Markers
- Other Paint
- Not Paint

### 3. Testing

- a. One category at a time, test each tube to make sure it is still usable.
- b. Shake the bottle before opening.
- c. Each type of paint has different properties such as viscosity and color, so consult a paint team expert to know if something is still usable.

- d. Sort bad paints into the “for landfill” or “for Resource Recovery” categories based on the type of paint.

#### 4. Price

- a. Price according to the Price List below, scaling down the price based on how much is left in the bottle.
- b. Sort out paint that is very low (worth less than 25 ¢ by itself), bundle based on the next step.
- c. Return the ‘not paint’ category to processing.

#### General Pricing Conventions

- ★ Always round to the nearest 25¢
- ★ For anything less than \$1: use ¢ to the right, avoid decimals (i.e. 25¢, not \$0.25)
- ★ For any full dollar: use \$ to the left, avoid decimals (i.e. \$1, not \$1.00)
  - Unless if not full dollar, write as \$1.50
- ★ If pricing per measurement: round **down** the price to the nearest length/weight

#### 5. Bundling Low Paint

- a. Make bundles that go well together (same type of paint or use case) and price at about 10c each (rounded down to the nearest quarter increment).
  - I.e. 4 bottles of low acrylic paint = 25c, 6 dried or little tubes of watercolor paint = 50c.
- b. Mark the bag “low paint - \$price”.

#### 6. Shelf

- a. Once all paint is priced, shelve in the appropriate location in the center.

## Price List

If a type of paint is not listed, then price it at 20% - 40% of retail price\*\*Determining factors for price point

- New (higher end) vs used (lower end)
- Brand of paint
