Punjabi has more than 125 million native speakers in India, Pakistan and around the world! It is the most widely spoken language of Pakistan and the 11th most widely spoken language of India. Like Hindi, Bengali, Urdu and Marathi, Punjabi developed from ancient Sanskrit.







There are several dialects of Punjabi including Majhi (standard Punjabi), Shahpuri, Malwai, Doabi, Puadhi, Jhangochi/Jhangvi, Jatki/Jangli/Rachnavi and Chenavari.

Punjabi has two written forms: Gurmukhī and Shahmukhī.
