 - Winter Storm / Blizzard Preparedness
 - Every area in Colorado has the potential to be impacted by severe winter weather. Some winter storms are large enough to affect several states, while others affect only a single community. Winter storms can range from a moderate snow over a few hours to a blizzard that lasts for several days.
 - Familiarizing yourself with the terms below may help with what to expect so you can properly prepare.
 - Winter Weather Advisory Winter weather conditions are expected to cause significant inconveniences and may be hazardous. When caution is used, these situations should not be life threatening.
 - Winter Storm Watch A winter storm is possible in your area. Tune in to NOAA Weather Radio, commercial radio, or television for more information.
 - Winter Storm Warning A winter storm is occurring or will soon occur in your area.
 - Blizzard Warning Sustained winds or frequent gusts to 35 miles per hour or greater and considerable amounts of falling or blowing snow (reducing visibility to less than a quarter mile) are expected to prevail for a period of three hours or longer.
 - Frost/Freeze Warning Below freezing temperatures are expected.
