Research from the *National Summer Learning Association* shows that students can lose up to **two months of reading skills** over the summer if they don't engage in educational activities.

These losses are cumulative—by 5th grade, children who don't read in the summer can be **2.5 years behind** their peers in reading levels.

A study by *Alexander, Entwisle, and Olson (2007)* found that **access to books and summer reading** accounted for most of the reading achievement gap between low- and high-income students.

According to the Scholastic Kids & Family Reading Report, 89% of kids say their favorite books are the ones they picked out themselves. Even casual summer reading helps maintain and expand vocabulary and comprehension. A 20-minute daily reading habit exposes students to about 1.8 million words per year.

The Takeaway: Summer reading keeps skills sharp, boosts confidence, and sets students up for success in the next school year. Let's keep those pages turning!
