

AP Psychology Test "Retake" option

* During the semester, you may exercise a "retake" option on any **two** unit tests.

* You needn't have "done badly" on a test to retake it; IF YOU ARE NOT CONTENT WITH THE SCORE YOU GOT (whether it be a '55' or an '85'), THAT'S REASON ENOUGH TO DO A RE-TAKE

* You must do the retake test (which will cover the same material, as summarized on your "test prep" scheme, that the original test assessed, but will be in a different format) within one week from the day you got your original test back from me

* I'll give your original score 1/3 weight, and your retake score 2/3 weight. So, if you got a '70' on test #1, and then got a '100' on the retake:

$70 + 100 + 100 = 270$, divided by 3, so your
new score on the unit test would be a '90'

* If your retake score is lower than your original score (that's rare, but it could happen of course), then I simply throw that out and go with your original score. EXERCISING YOUR RETAKE OPTION CAN ONLY HELP YOUR GRADE, IT CAN NEVER HURT YOUR GRADE
