Gender-Based Violence Presentations

Objectives:

- → We will be able to read expository texts from around the world, about gender-based violence.
- → We will be able to synthesize the information into its most important points.
- → We will be able to present a summary of the important points, visually (through a powerpoint) and orally (aloud to our group members).

Directions:

- 1. Read one of the following articles. Make sure each person in your group has chosen a different article.
 - □ Nepal: Chaupadi Culture and Violence Against Women
 - □ Everyday Violence Against Pregnant Women in India
 - ☐ Family Planning Misconceptions in Nigeria
 - ☐ On the UN, youth, and child brides
- 2. Pull out the most important (salient) information from the text. Consider the following questions:
 - ★ What is the subject of the article?
 - ★ Where does it take place?
 - ★ What are some of the stakeholders (victims, oppressors, government, public opinion), and what are their viewpoints on the issue?
 - ★ What are the issues of injustice? How do they pertain (relate) to Millenium Development Goals, and gender-based violence?
 - ★ Is there a solution to the problem? What would it take for that to happen?
 - ★ What literary devices does the author use to create her point (mood, setting, characterization, imagery, metaphor, etc)?
 - ★ Who is the intended audience, and is the message being heard by those whom it most affects?
- 3. Make a powerpoint slide, based on your main points. See below for possible template:
 - → <u>Template</u>: Make a copy, share with your group members. Each person completes their own slide.
