"TRILOGIES" TRILOGY FORMAT

General

- The Trilogy format is a two-player constructed format in which players prepare three decks and play a special best-of-three match with those decks.

Deckbuilding/card legality

- Each Trilogy deck must include: Exactly 1 leader. Exactly 1 base and a minimum of 50 other cards (consisting of units, events, and upgrades)
- All deckbuilding restrictions that usually apply to a single Premier deck apply to the entire set of three Trilogy decks. A set of three Trilogy decks cannot include more than 1 copy of any leader or base or more than 3 copies of any unit, event, or upgrade among all three decks combined.
- All printings of a card, whether in multiple sets or as promo's, count as the same card for the purpose of the deckbuilding rules.
- Each player must construct a deck containing only cards from era 1, a deck containing only cards from era 2, and a deck containing only cards from era 3 of the card legality list. Cards that are from multiple era's must still meet the restriction of a maximum of 3 copies across all 3 decks.
- <u>The card legality list</u> includes an overview of which cards can be played and from which era they originate. Cards marked as era 4 are not legal for this tournament.
- Trilogy decks do not include a sideboard.

Best-of-Three Match

- Players begin a Trilogy match with a Ban Phase. In the Ban Phase, each player presents their three leader-base pairings to their opponent. Each player then secretly chooses one of their opponent's decks to ban from the match. Both players simultaneously reveal their choices, and the chosen decks are put aside and become unavailable for the rest of the match. Both players then secretly choose and simultaneously reveal which of their decks they will play in game 1.
- After a game finishes, the winning deck is put aside and becomes unavailable for the rest of the match. In case of a draw, players must replay the game with the same decks. The first player to win two games wins the match.
- If a player loses game 1 of the match, they may choose to play the same deck in game 2 or to play their other available deck. The winner of game 1 will only have one available deck to play.

Other rules

Unless stated otherwise in the rules above, all rules for premier play apply.
