

Everipedia's Best Page of the Week Contest (Draft)

This is just a draft it will be open to everyone so we will put the final copy as a wiki on Everipedia

To encourage and reward our editors for the great Everipedia pages that they create we've decided to create a weekly contest where the editor who creates the best page as judged by the Everipedia team receives 5000 IQ. The pages will be judged on a variety of factors including quality, uniqueness, traffic, length, media, social media shares, and other factors.

Steps

Step 1: Picking a page of your choice

You can create a page about any topic that is appropriate (no pages involving graphic violence or adult content). Make sure to pick something good because you can only submit one page every week. While traffic is a factor it is only one of many factors. A page with a low amount of traffic but is high quality and unique can definitely still win. Step 2: Creating the page

The next step is to create the page. Make sure it meets the minimum requirements and to go above and beyond. This contest is all about the best pages on Everipedia so make sure to add as much good quality information, media, infoboxes, references, tables, sections, and other

elements as you can. While it's important to have a page that has a lot of information it is also important to make sure that the writing is logical, concise with no unnecessary or confusing words, and with no spelling and grammar mistakes.

Before submitting your page feel free to reach out to @EwokABdevito for advice on how to improve your page so you have the best chance of winning. However remember that there is only one winner each week so even if you make all the improvements you may still not win.

Step 3: Entering your page in the contest

You must enter your page in the contest by **x date**. To make an entry add your name as a header to the entries section and link your page below your name. Remember that you can only submit one page every week so make sure to submit your very best work.

Step 4: Winning

We will announce the winner, send them their 5,000 IQ reward, and share their page across our social media on **x date**.

What are the minimum requirements?

All pages that are entered in the contest must include the requirement outlined in the bullet points below to be eligible. However meeting the minimum requirements is not a guarantee that you will win. To win your page must be the very best page created in the week so the entries will be judged against each other rather than against the requirements. If your page does not meet the minimum requirements but is very high quality you

may still be eligible. If this is the case reach out to [@EwokABdevito](#) and he will let you know if the page is eligible.

- At least 2000 characters in the page's main body (~8 paragraphs or 600 words)
- At least 10 edits per page
- Introduction should be at least 1 short paragraph or 150 words.
- At least three sections after the introduction
 - Ex. Early Life & Education, Career, and Personal Life
- 1 high-resolution featured image (preferably at least 900x900)
 - Images cannot be blurry
- 9 high-resolution images and/or videos in the media gallery (preferably at least 900x900 for images or 720p for videos)
- At least 4 citations
 - Citations should link to the actual webpage where the information comes from rather than just the search results.
 - Ex. [Webpage](#) with the cited information vs. [Search results](#)
- At least 5 infobox items
- At least 5 categories (only a requirement for pages made about people)
- At least 10 internal links (i.e. two places where additional Everipedia pages are linked within the body of the text)
- Pages must be written in the editor's own words or paraphrased and **cannot be plagiarized**.
 - The information on the page should be modified or summarized.
 - Information shouldn't be copied and pasted and it shouldn't look the exact same as the site you found the information on.
- There should be no spelling and grammar mistakes.
- The subject of an article cannot have an existing Everipedia or Wikipedia page.

Examples of some of our best pages

The best pages on Everipedia are in-depth, interesting, unique, use media well, well-written, and get a large amount of traffic. A winning page can cover any topic that is appropriate. Some weeks the winning page may be one that has a lot of traffic another week it may be one that does not but is very in-depth. One week it may be one that is based on a person another week it may be one that is based on a concept.
