Common Art Assignment

Artist Alexandra Bell's "radical edits" of news stories question the way race, gender, class, and sexuality bias our understanding of the world around us. Bell highlights flawed reporting into counternarratives that contradict the dominant narrative and challenge others to take a more critical stance against the news they consume.

In this assignment, you will follow Bell's example and evaluate a *New York Times* article discussing Serena Williams's loss at the 2009 US Open.
